A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as "El Yunque National Forest

5 Preservation Act".

3 (a) AUTHORITY TO ACQUIRE LANDS.—The Secretary
4 of Agriculture is authorized to acquire, by donation or
5 purchase from willing sellers, tracts of land or interests
6 in land, not in Federal ownership as of the date of the
7 enactment of this Act, that—

8 (1) are located within the established bound9 aries of El Yunque National Forest in Puerto Rico;
10 or

11 (2) abut the boundaries of El Yunque National12 Forest.

13 (b) SOURCE OF FUNDS FOR LAND ACQUISITION.— To fund the land acquisition authorized by subsection (a), 14 the Secretary may use all amounts generated from El 15 Yunque National Forest that are deposited in the National 16 Forest Fund, except those amounts required by law to be 17 18 paid to Puerto Rico. Amounts made available to the Sec-19 retary under this subsection shall remain available until 20expended and without further appropriation.

(c) BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT.—To the extent the
Secretary acquires land described in subsection (a)(2), the
Secretary shall adjust the boundaries of El Yunque National Forest to include the acquired lands. For purposes
of section 7 of the Land and Water Conservation Fund
Act of 1965 (16 U.S.C. 460l–9), the boundaries of El

Yunque National Forest, as adjusted pursuant to this sub section, shall be considered to be boundaries of the Na tional Forest as of January 1, 1965.

4 (d) Relation to Other Land Acquisition Au-5 THORITY.—The creation of a dedicated source of funds 6 under subsection (b) for the acquisition of land under sub-7 section (a) within or abutting the boundaries of El Yunque 8 National Forest shall not be construed to prohibit or limit 9 the use of amounts in the Land and Water Conservation 10 Fund to finance land acquisition associated with El Yunque National Forest. The land acquisition authority 11 12 provided by subsection (a), and funds provided under sub-13 section (b), are intended to supplement, and not supplant, 14 other sources of funds for land acquisition associated with 15 El Yunque National Forest.
