Mr. KING of New York (for himself and Mr. McCAUL) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to collaborate on foreign terrorist organization designations.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “FTO Reform Act of
5 2014”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF STATE AND DEPARTMENT OF**
7 **HOMELAND SECURITY COLLABORATION.**

8 (a) DESIGNATION.—Section 219(d) of the Immigra-
9 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189(d)) is amended—

10 (1) in paragraph (3)—

1 (A) by inserting “Homeland Security and
2 Governmental Affairs,” before “and Foreign
3 Relations of the Senate”; and

4 (B) by striking “and International Rela-
5 tions of the House of Representatives” and in-
6 serting “Homeland Security, and Foreign Af-
7 fairs of the House of Representatives”; and

8 (2) in paragraph (4), by inserting after “Sec-
9 retary of the Treasury” the following: “, the Sec-
10 retary of Homeland Security,”.

11 (b) CONSULTATION.—Section 219 of the Immigra-
12 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189) is amended—

13 (1) in subsection (a)(1), in the matter pre-
14 ceding subparagraph (A), by inserting “, in accord-
15 ance with subsection (d),” after “The Secretary”;

16 (2) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-
17 section (e); and

18 (3) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
19 lowing new subsection:

20 “(d) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary of Homeland
21 Security shall, as soon as practicable, transmit to the Sec-
22 retary the recommendations of the Secretary of Homeland
23 Security to the Secretary of State regarding the designa-
24 tion under this section of an organization as a foreign ter-
25 rorist organization, including an assessment of the threat

1 to national security due to terrorist activity or terrorism
2 carried out by the organization under review.”.

3 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 120 days after the date
4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland
5 Security shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Se-
6 curity of the House of Representatives and the Committee
7 on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs a report
8 on the the following:

9 (1) The activities of the Department of Home-
10 land Security relating to Foreign Terrorist Organi-
11 zation (FTO) designations, and an accounting of the
12 effects each such designation has on the Depart-
13 ment’s operations.

14 (2) The number of individuals denied entry into
15 the United States due to their support for an FTO
16 and an identification of such FTOs.

17 (3) The number of individuals removed from
18 the United States due to their support for an FTO
19 and an identification of such FTOs.

20 (4) A list of all revocations of otherwise ineli-
21 gible nonimmigrant visas considered by the Depart-
22 ment of Homeland Security.

- 1 (5) A list of all individuals with respect to
- 2 whom a revocation was granted, their associations
- 3 with an FTO, and an identification of such FTOs.

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
