A BILL

To prohibit United States contributions to the United Nations International Organization for Migration (IOM), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “No Tax Dollars for
3 the United Nation’s Immigration Invasion Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.**

5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Fed-
6 eral Government may not make a contribution to the
7 United Nations International Organization for Migration
8 (IOM), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refu-
9 gees (UNHCR), or the United Nations Relief and Works
10 Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East
11 (UNRWA).

12 **SEC. 3. GAO STUDY AND REPORT.**

13 (a) STUDY.—The Comptroller General of the United
14 States shall conduct a study to—

15 (1) identify all Federal assistance programs
16 that provide funds in the form of grants or loans to
17 the United Nations IOM, UNHCR, and UNRWA;

18 (2) for each of fiscal years 2021 and 2022,
19 identify the total amount of funds provided to IOM,
20 UNHCR, and UNRWA, including the amount pro-
21 vided under each Federal assistance program identi-
22 fied under paragraph (1);

23 (3) identify any restrictions under each Federal
24 assistance program identified under paragraph (1)
25 regarding such funding; and

1 (4) assess and specify the amount of funds
2 IOM, UNHCR, and UNRWA should repay to the
3 United States Government.

4 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
5 of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall
6 submit to Congress a report that contains the results of
7 the study required by subsection (a).

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
