Mr. STOCKMAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To redesignate the Frances Perkins Department of Labor building located at 200 Constitution Ave., NW in Washington, DC as the “Reed Larson Department of Labor Building”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Honoring Workers’
5 Rights Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (a) Reed Larson was the driving force behind one of
2 the greatest expansions of workers' rights, the Right to
3 Work.

4 (b) The overwhelming majority of Americans and
5 union workers agree no one should have to pay a union
6 boss to get or keep a job.

7 (c) Millions of workers around the country can now
8 choose whether to join a union because of Reed Larson's
9 life work.

10 (d) A union accountable to its members is a union
11 that can better represent its members.

12 **SEC. 3. REED LARSON DEPARTMENT OF LABOR BUILDING.**

13 (a) DESIGNATION.—The Department of Labor build-
14 ing located at 200 Constitution Ave., NW in Washington,
15 DC is redesignated as the “Reed Larson Building”.

16 (b) REFERENCES.—Any reference in a law, map, reg-
17 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the United
18 States to the facility referenced to subsection (a) shall be
19 deemed to be a reference to the “Reed Larson Department
20 of Labor Building”.
