# H. R. 7491

To establish a task force on waterway freight diversification and economic development in the Ohio, Allegheny, and Monongahela River corridors, and for other purposes.

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## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. DELUZIO (for himself and Ms. LEE of Pennsylvania) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

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## A BILL

To establish a task force on waterway freight diversification and economic development in the Ohio, Allegheny, and Monongahela River corridors, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Waterway Activation  
5       that Targets Economic Revitalization, Welcomes Activity,  
6       and Yields Success Act” or the “WATERWAYS Act”.

1   **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

2       Congress finds that—

3               (1) inland waterways provide a valuable re-  
4               source for moving agricultural, energy, and other  
5               commodities to market in the United States;

6               (2) further utilization of the waterways would  
7               benefit the United States because barges are among  
8               the safest and most environmentally responsible  
9               ways to transport freight, with barge transport being  
10              more fuel efficient and having lower emissions than  
11              other methods, while also resulting in fewer injuries  
12              per worker than rail or truck transport;

13              (3) given existing issues with supply chains, it  
14              is critical that the Federal Government work to ex-  
15              pand and promote inland waterway access, especially  
16              in regions that are coal communities or have suf-  
17              fered from deindustrialization; and

18              (4) it is of critical importance that the invest-  
19              ments made possible by the Infrastructure Invest-  
20              ment and Jobs Act (Public Law 117–58; 135 Stat.  
21              429), Public Law 117–169 (commonly known as the  
22              “Inflation Reduction Act of 2022”) (136 Stat.  
23              1818), and other recent legislation, such as Public  
24              Law 117–167 (commonly known as the “CHIPS  
25              and Science Act of 2022”) (136 Stat. 1366), are  
26              made with an eye toward utilizing the inland water-

ways network to maximize the impact of those investments.

### **3 SEC. 3. TASK FORCE ON WATERWAY FREIGHT DIVERSIFICATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.**

5       (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

6                             (1) COVERED STATE.—The term “covered  
7 State” means each of the States of Pennsylvania,  
8 West Virginia, Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky, Ohio, and  
9 Tennessee.

17                             (3) TASK FORCE.—The term “task force”  
18                             means the task force established under subsection  
19                             (b).

20       (b) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Interagency Working  
21 Group shall establish a task force on waterway freight di-  
22 versification and economic development in the Ohio, Alle-  
23 gheny, and Monongahela River corridors.

### 24 (c) MEMBERSHIP.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The task force shall be composed of—

(A) from the Federal Government, representatives of—

5 (i) the Department of Transportation;

6 (ii) the Corps of Engineers;

7 (iii) the Department of Energy;

8 (iv) the Department of Commer

(v) the Department of Agriculture;

(vi) the Economic Development

11 ministration;

12 (vii) the Maritime Administration;

13 (viii) the Department of Labor;

16 (x) the Coast Guard;

17 (xi) the Environmental Protection  
18 Agency;

19 (xii) the Department of the Interior;

20 and

(xiii) any other Federal agency or department the Co-Chairs of the Interagency Working Group determine to be appropriate;

(B) at the discretion of a covered State, representatives of relevant agencies of the covered State; and

(C) local stakeholders involved in economic development, transportation, community development, and water resource development and conservation along the Ohio, Allegheny, and Monongahela River corridors, such as metropolitan and rural planning organizations, economic development districts, units of local government, and community-based organizations.

(2) APPOINTMENT.—The Co-Chairs of the Interagency Working Group shall appoint the members of the task force under paragraph (1).

(d) DUTIES.—The task force shall—

(1) convene on an ad hoc basis to study, and develop recommendations to improve, waterway freight use and economic development in the Ohio, Allegheny, and Monongahela River corridors;

(2) facilitate investment in the Ohio, Allegheny, and Monongahela River corridors by identifying critical projects and connecting those projects with Federal, State, and local funding opportunities;

(3) coordinate and activate stakeholders around waterway development; and

(4) submit to the Interagency Working Group  
an annual report that describes—

(B) the activities of the task force under paragraphs (2) and (3).

8       (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
9 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section  
10 \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through 2034,  
11 to remain available until expended.
