## A BILL

To amend title 28, United States Code, to prohibit the issuance of national injunctions, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Injunctive Authority
- 5 Clarification Act of 2019".
- 6 SEC. 2. ORDERS PURPORTING TO RESTRAIN ENFORCE-
- 7 MENT AGAINST NON-PARTIES.
- 8 (a) In General.—Chapter 155 of title 28, United
- 9 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 10 lowing:

### 1 "§ 2285. Orders purporting to restrain enforcement

- 2 against non-parties
- 3 "No court of the United States (and no district court
- 4 of the Virgin Islands, Guam, or the Northern Mariana Is-
- 5 lands) shall issue an order that purports to restrain the
- 6 enforcement against a non-party of any statute, regula-
- 7 tion, order, or similar authority, unless the non-party is
- 8 represented by a party acting in a representative capacity
- 9 pursuant to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.".
- 10 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
- 11 for chapter 155 of title 28, United States Code is amended
- 12 by inserting after the item relating to section 2285 the
- 13 following:

"2285. Orders purporting to restrain enforcement against non-parties.".
