A BILL

To require the Federal Emergency Management Agency to continue to provide certain supplies to schools that provide in-person learning.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Masks for Students
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FEMA PUBLIC ASSISTANCE FOR SCHOOLS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—During the coronavirus emer-
8 gency period, FEMA Policy 104–009–19 (relating to pub-
9 lic assistance), as in effect on the day before the date of
10 enactment of this Act, shall remain in effect to provide

1 cloth facial coverings to public schools (kindergarten
2 through 12th grade) that provide in-person learning.

3 (b) CORONAVIRUS EMERGENCY PERIOD.—For pur-
4 poses of this section, the coronavirus emergency period is
5 the period beginning on March 13, 2020, and ending on
6 the later of—

7 (1) the last day on which the declaration of
8 emergency involving Federal primary responsibility
9 determined to exist by the President under section
10 501(b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
11 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5191(b)) with
12 respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–
13 19) is in effect; or

14 (2) the last day on which the declaration of na-
15 tional emergency declared by the President under
16 the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1601 et
17 seq.) with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019
18 (COVID–19) is in effect.

○
