Mr. COURTNEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Education and Labor

A BILL

To provide that, due to the disruptions caused by COVID–19, applications for impact aid funding for fiscal year 2022 may use certain data submitted in the fiscal year 2021 application.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Impact Aid
5 Coronavirus Relief Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. IMPACT AID PROGRAM.**

7 Due to the public health emergency relating to
8 COVID–19 and notwithstanding sections 7002(j) and

1 7003(c) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act
2 of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7702(j), 7703(c)), a local educational
3 agency desiring to receive a payment under section 7002
4 or 7003 of such Act (20 U.S.C. 7702, 7703) for fiscal
5 year 2022 that also submitted an application for such pay-
6 ment for fiscal year 2021 shall, in the application sub-
7 mitted under section 7005 of such Act (20 U.S.C. 7705)
8 for fiscal year 2022—

9 (1) with respect to a requested payment under
10 section 7002 of such Act—

11 (A) use the data described in section
12 7002(j) of such Act relating to calculating such
13 payment that was submitted by the local edu-
14 cational agency in the application for fiscal year
15 2021; or

16 (B) use the data relating to calculating
17 such payment for the fiscal year required under
18 section 7002(j) of such Act; and

19 (2) with respect to a requested payment under
20 section 7003 of such Act—

21 (A) use the student count data relating to
22 calculating such payment that was submitted by
23 the local educational agency in the application
24 for fiscal year 2021, provided that payments for
25 fiscal year 2022 shall be calculated by the Sec-

1 retary using the expenditures and rates de-
2 scribed in clauses (i), (ii), (iii), and (iv) of sec-
3 tion 7003(b)(1)(C) of such Act that would oth-
4 erwise apply for fiscal year 2022; or

5 (B) use the student count data relating to
6 calculating such payment for the fiscal year re-
7 quired under section 7003(c) of such Act.

8 **SEC. 3. MIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM.**

9 Due to the public health emergency relating to
10 COVID–19 and notwithstanding subsections (a)(1) and
11 (f)(1) of section 1303 of the Elementary and Secondary
12 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6393), for the purposes
13 of making determinations under subsections (a)(1) and (f)
14 of such section 1303 for fiscal year 2021 and all subse-
15 quent fiscal years for which school year 2019–2020 data
16 would be used in the calculations under section 1303(a)(1)
17 of such Act, the Secretary of Education shall use school
18 year 2018–2019 data or school year 2019–2020 data,
19 whichever data are greater, wherever school year 2019–
20 2020 data would otherwise be required.

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
