A BILL

To nullify the effect of Executive Order 13950 relating to combating race and sex stereotyping.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RECESSION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The provisions of Executive Order
5 13950 (85 Fed. Reg. 60683; relating to combating race

1 and sex stereotyping) are rescinded and shall have no force
2 or effect.

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect as
4 if enacted on September 22, 2020.
