A BILL

To amend the Rural Electrification Act of 1936 to provide requirements on the use of assistance for broadband deployment, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Reprioritizing
5 Unserved Rural Areas and Locations for Broadband Act
6 of 2023” and the “RURAL Broadband Act of 2023”.

1 **SEC. 2. USE OF ASSISTANCE FOR DEPLOYMENT OF**
2 **BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE.**

3 Title VI of the Rural Electrification Act of 1936 (7
4 U.S.C. 950bb et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
5 the following:

6 **“SEC. 607. USE OF ASSISTANCE FOR DEPLOYMENT OF**
7 **BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE.**

8 “(a) DEFINITION OF QUALIFYING BROADBAND-CA-
9 PABLE INFRASTRUCTURE.—In this section, the term
10 ‘qualifying broadband-capable infrastructure’ means fixed
11 terrestrial broadband-capable infrastructure—

12 “(1) used by a service provider to provide fixed
13 terrestrial broadband service for which the service
14 provider receives universal service support under sec-
15 tion 254 of the Communications Act of 1934 (47
16 U.S.C. 254), if—

17 “(A) the broadband service satisfies the
18 current speed benchmark for fixed services es-
19 tablished by the Federal Communications Com-
20 mission under section 706 of the Telecommuni-
21 cations Act of 1996 (47 U.S.C. 1302); or

22 “(B) the service provider is in compliance
23 with buildout obligations in the relevant area to
24 provide retail fixed terrestrial broadband service
25 that will comply with the applicable broadband

1 speed standard described in subparagraph (A);

2 or

3 “(2) that—

4 “(A) was financed with funds provided by
5 the Secretary under this Act or any other pro-
6 gram carried out by the Secretary for the costs
7 of the construction, improvement, or acquisition
8 of facilities or equipment for the purpose of
9 providing fixed terrestrial telecommunications
10 or broadband service; and

11 “(B)(i) is used to provide fixed terrestrial
12 broadband service, if—

13 “(I) the broadband service satisfies
14 any applicable broadband speed standards
15 established by the Secretary; or

16 “(II) the service provider is in compli-
17 ance with buildout obligations in the rel-
18 evant area to provide retail fixed terrestrial
19 broadband service that will comply with
20 the applicable broadband speed standards
21 described in subclause (I); or

22 “(ii) was financed with a loan under this
23 Act or any other program carried out by the
24 Secretary that remains outstanding for the pur-

1 pose of providing fixed terrestrial telecommuni-
2 cations or broadband service.

3 “(b) RESTRICTION ON USE OF ASSISTANCE.—A loan,
4 grant, or other assistance awarded under this Act, or by
5 the rural development mission area under the Consoli-
6 dated Farm and Rural Development Act (7 U.S.C. 1921
7 et seq.), may not be used to coordinate, approve, or fi-
8 nance the deployment of broadband-capable infrastructure
9 by a service provider to provide retail fixed broadband
10 service that would overbuild or otherwise duplicate quali-
11 fying broadband-capable infrastructure that another serv-
12 ice provider is using to provide retail fixed terrestrial
13 broadband service in the same geographic area.

14 “(c) USE OF ASSISTANCE IN UNSERVED AREAS.—
15 A loan, grant, or other assistance provided by the Sec-
16 retary hereunder, acting through the Administrator of the
17 Rural Utilities Service, to coordinate, approve, or finance
18 the deployment of broadband-capable infrastructure by a
19 service provider may be used to provide retail fixed
20 broadband service only in a geographic area in which there
21 is no qualifying broadband-capable infrastructure owned
22 or operated by another service provider.”.
