Mr. ROY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 7888) to reform the foreign intelligence surveillance act of 1978; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 529) to extend the customs waters of the United States, consistent with presidential proclamation 7219; providing for consideration of the resolution (H.Res. 1112) denouncing the Biden’s administration’s immigration policies; and providing for consideration of the resolution

(H.Res. 1117) opposing efforts to place one-sided pressure on Israel with respect to Gaza.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 7888) to reform the Foreign Intel-
6 ligence Surveillance Act of 1978. The first reading of the
7 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against
8 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall
9 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed two hours
10 equally divided among and controlled by the chair and
11 ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judici-
12 ary or their respective designees and the chair and ranking
13 minority member of the Permanent Select Committee on
14 Intelligence or their respective designees. After general de-
15 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the
16 five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read. All
17 points of order against provisions in the bill are waived.
18 No amendment to the bill shall be in order except those
19 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
20 panying this resolution. Each such amendment may be of-
21 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-
22 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall
23 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-
24 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the

1 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-
2 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
3 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the
4 Whole. All points of order against such amendments are
5 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
6 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
7 to the House with such amendments as may have been
8 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
9 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
10 without intervening motion except one motion to recom-
11 mit.

12 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
13 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 529) to
14 extend the customs waters of the United States from 12
15 nautical miles to 24 nautical miles from the baselines of
16 the United States, consistent with Presidential Proclama-
17 tion 7219. All points of order against consideration of the
18 bill are waived. The amendment in the nature of a sub-
19 stitute recommended by the Committee on Ways and
20 Means now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopt-
21 ed. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All
22 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,
23 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as
24 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further
25 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening

1 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
2 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
3 the Committee on Ways and Means or their respective des-
4 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

5 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-
7 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 1112) denounc-
8 ing the Biden administration's immigration policies. The
9 resolution shall be considered as read. The previous ques-
10 tion shall be considered as ordered on the resolution and
11 preamble to adoption without intervening motion or de-
12 mand for division of the question except one hour of de-
13 bate equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-
14 ing minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary
15 or their respective designees.

16 SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
17 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-
18 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 1117) opposing
19 efforts to place one-sided pressure on Israel with respect
20 to Gaza. The resolution shall be considered as read. The
21 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
22 resolution and preamble to adoption without intervening
23 motion or demand for division of the question except one
24 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
