3	(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
4	(1) AFFILIATED AREA.—The term "affiliated
5	area" means the Parker's Crossroads Battlefield es-
6	tablished as an affiliated area of the National Park
7	System by subsection $(c)(1)$.
8	(2) PARK.—The term "Park" means Shiloh
9	National Military Park, a unit of the National Park
10	System.
11	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
12	the Secretary of the Interior.
13	(b) Areas To Be Added to Shiloh National
14	Military Park.—
15	(1) ADDITIONAL AREAS.—The boundary of the
16	Park is modified to include the areas that are gen-
17	erally depicted on the map entitled "Shiloh National
18	Military Park, Proposed Boundary Adjustment",
19	numbered 304/80,011, and dated July 2014, and
20	which are comprised of—
21	(A) Fallen Timbers Battlefield;
22	(B) Russell House Battlefield; and
23	(C) Davis Bridge Battlefield.
24	(2) Acquisition Authority.—The Secretary
25	may acquire the land described in paragraph (1) by

 donation, purchase from willing sellers with donated or appropriated funds, or exchange. (3) ADMINISTRATION.—Any land acquired under this subsection shall be administered as part

of the Park.
(c) Establishment of Affiliated Area.—
(1) IN GENERAL.—Parker's Crossroads Battle-
field in the State of Tennessee is established as an
affiliated area of the National Park System.
(2) Description of Affiliated Area.—The
affiliated area shall consist of the area generally de-
picted within the "Proposed Boundary" on the map
entitled "Parker's Crossroads Battlefield, Proposed
Boundary", numbered 903/80,073, and dated July
2014.
(3) Administration.—The affiliated area shall
be managed in accordance with—
(A) this section; and
(B) any law generally applicable to units of
the National Park System.
(4) MANAGEMENT ENTITY.—The City of Park-
ers Crossroads and the Tennessee Historical Com-
mission shall jointly be the management entity for
mission shan jointry be the management entity for

1	(5) Cooperative agreements.—The Sec-
2	retary may provide technical assistance and enter
3	into cooperative agreements with the management
4	entity for the purpose of providing financial assist-
5	ance for the marketing, marking, interpretation, and
6	preservation of the affiliated area.
7	(6) Limited role of the secretary.—Noth-
8	ing in this section authorizes the Secretary to ac-
9	quire property at the affiliated area or to assume
10	overall financial responsibility for the operation,
11	maintenance, or management of the affiliated area.
12	(7) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—
13	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in con-
14	sultation with the management entity, shall de-
15	velop a general management plan for the affili-
16	ated area in accordance with section 100502 of
17	title 54, United States Code.
18	(B) TRANSMITTAL.—Not later than 3
19	years after the date on which funds are first
20	made available to carry out this section, the
21	Secretary shall submit to the Committee on En-
22	ergy and Natural Resources of the Senate and
23	the Committee on Natural Resources of the
