3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Age 21 Act".

5 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON PURCHASE OF CERTAIN FIRE-

6 ARMS BY INDIVIDUALS UNDER 21 YEARS OF 7 AGE.

8 (a) DEFINITIONS.—Section 921(a) of title 18, United

munition feeding device that can be removed from a fire-

"(40) The term 'fixed magazine' means an ammuni-
tion feeding device that is permanently fixed to the firearm
in such a manner that it cannot be removed without dis-
assembly of the firearm.
"(41) The term 'folding, telescoping, or detachable
stock' means a stock that folds, telescopes, detaches or
otherwise operates to reduce the length, size, or any other

dimension, or otherwise enhances the concealability, of a
 firearm.

3 "(42) The term 'forward grip' means a grip located4 forward of the trigger that functions as a pistol grip.

5 "(43) The term 'grenade launcher' means an attach6 ment for use on a firearm that is designed to propel a
7 grenade or other similar destructive device.

8 "(44) The term 'pistol grip' means a grip, a thumb9 hole stock or Thordsen-type grip or stock, or any other
10 characteristic that can function as a grip.

"(45) The term 'threaded barrel' means a feature or
characteristic that is designed in such a manner to allow
for the attachment of a device such as a firearm silencer
or a flash suppressor.

15 "(46) The term 'belt-fed semiautomatic firearm'16 means any repeating firearm that—

17 "(A) utilizes a portion of the energy of a firing
