4	Section 444(b)(1) of the General Education Provi-
5	sions Act (20 U.S.C. 1232g(b)(1)) is amended—
6	(1) in subparagraph (K)(ii), by striking "and"
7	after the semicolon;
8	(2) in subparagraph (L), by striking the period
9	at the end and inserting "; and; and
10	(3) by inserting after subparagraph (L) the fol-
11	lowing:
12	"(M) an institution of postsecondary education
13	in which the student was previously enrolled, to
14	which records of postsecondary coursework and cred-
15	its are sent for the purpose of applying such course-
16	work and credits toward completion of a recognized
17	postsecondary credential (as that term is defined in
18	section 3 of the Workforce Innovation and Oppor-
19	tunity Act (29 U.S.C. 3102)), upon condition that
20	the student provides written consent prior to receiv-
21	ing such credential.".
