A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Agency PAYGO Act
3 of 2013”.

4 **SEC. 2. OFFSETS FOR INCREASED COSTS TO FEDERAL**
5 **AGENCIES FOR REGULATIONS LIMITING**
6 **GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS.**

7 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—If the Administrator of the Envi-
8 ronmental Protection Agency proposes a rule that limits
9 greenhouse gas emissions and imposes increased costs on
10 one or more other Federal agencies, the Administrator
11 shall include in the proposed rule an offset from funds
12 available to the Administrator for all projected increased
13 costs that the proposed rule would impose on other Fed-
14 eral agencies.

15 (b) **NO OFFSETS.**—If the Administrator proposes a
16 rule that limits greenhouse gas emissions and imposes in-
17 creased costs on one or more other Federal agencies but
18 does not provide an offset in accordance with paragraph
19 (1), the Administrator may not finalize the rule until the
20 promulgation of the final rule is approved by law.
