### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Southern New Mexico

# SEC. 2. TEMPORARY ADMITTANCE OF MEXICAN NATIONALS WITH BORDER CROSSING CARDS.

3 The Secretary of Homeland Security shall permit a national of Mexico, who enters the United States with a 4 5 valid Border Crossing Card (as described in section 212.1(c)(1)(i) of title 8, Code of Federal Regulations, as 6 7 in effect on the date of the enactment of this Act), and 8 who is admitted to the United States at the Columbus, 9 Santa Teresa, or Antelope Wells port of entry in New 10 Mexico, to remain in New Mexico (within 75 miles of the international border between the United States and Mex-11 12 ico) for a period not to exceed 30 days.
