Mr. DAINES introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs

A BILL

To require tribal liaisons to submit to Congress reports on missing and murdered Indians.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tribal Reporting and
5 Accountability to Congress Act” or the “TRAC Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON MISSING AND MURDERED INDIANS.**

7 Section 13 of the Indian Law Enforcement Reform
8 Act (25 U.S.C. 2810) is amended by adding at the end
9 the following:

1 “(e) REPORT ON MISSING AND MURDERED INDI-
2 ANS.—Each tribal liaison appointed under this section
3 shall submit to Congress an annual report that includes,
4 with respect to the district—

5 “(1) the number of open missing Indians cases;

6 “(2) the number of open murdered Indians
7 cases;

8 “(3) the number of missing and murdered Indi-
9 ans cases resolved;

10 “(4) the number of missing and murdered Indi-
11 ans cases reported each year;

12 “(5) the number of missing and murdered Indi-
13 ans cold cases;

14 “(6) the number of individuals the Department
15 of Justice has actively working on missing and mur-
16 dered Indians cases;

17 “(7) the number of cases referred to the De-
18 partment of Justice for prosecution from the Bureau
19 of Indian Affairs and Tribal law enforcement agen-
20 cies; and

21 “(8) the number cases declined to be prosecuted
22 by the Department of Justice and the reasons why
23 each case was not prosecuted.”.
