### **3** SECTION 1. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

4 It is the sense of Congress that to avoid further im-5 posing unnecessary and costly regulatory burdens on 6 United States workers and businesses, it is urgent that 7 the TWIC application process be reformed before the end of 2012, when many of the more than 1,000,000 current
 TWIC holders will be required to renew their Transpor tation Worker Identification Credentials.

### 4 SEC. 2. DEFINITION.

5 In this Act, the terms "Transportation Worker Iden-6 tification Credential" and "TWIC" mean the transpor-7 tation security card issued under section 70105 of title 8 46, United States Code.

# 9 SEC. 3. TRANSPORTATION WORKER IDENTIFICATION CRE10 DENTIAL APPLICATION REFORM.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall reform the process for the enrollment,
activation, issuance, and renewal of Transportation Worker Identification Credentials to require not more than 1
in-person visit to a designated enrollment center, except
as provided under subsection (b).

(b) EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES.—The Secretary
may require a TWIC applicant to visit a designated enrollment center more than once under extenuating circumstances, as determined by the Secretary.

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
