A BILL

- To direct the Attorney General to submit to Congress investigative materials in the event of certain pardons granted by the President, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Abuse of the Pardon
 - 5 Prevention Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT RELATING TO CER-
 - 7 TAIN PARDONS.
 - 8 (a) Submission of Information.—In the event
 - 9 that the President grants an individual a pardon for an

1	offense against the United States that arises from an in-
2	vestigation in which the President, or a relative of the
3	President, is a target, subject, or witness, not later than
4	30 days after the date of such pardon, the Attorney Gen-
5	eral shall submit to the chairmen and ranking members
6	of the appropriate congressional committees all materials
7	of an investigation that were obtained by a United States
8	Attorney, another Federal prosecutor, or an investigative
9	authority of the Federal Government, relating to the of-
10	fense for which the individual is so pardoned.
11	(b) Treatment of Information.—Rule 6(e) of the
12	Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure may not be con-
13	strued to prohibit the disclosure of information required
14	by subsection (a) of this section.
15	(e) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply with
16	respect to a pardon granted by the President on or after
17	January 20, 2017.
18	(d) Definitions.—In this section:
19	(1) The term "appropriate congressional com-
20	mittees" means—
21	(A) the Committee on the Judiciary of the
22	House of Representatives and the Committee
23	on the Judiciary of the Senate; and
24	(B) if an investigation relates to intel-
25	ligence or counterintelligence matters, the Per-

1	manent Select Committee on Intelligence of the
2	House of Representatives and the Select Com-
3	mittee on Intelligence of the Senate.
4	(2) The term "pardon" includes a commutation
5	of sentence.
6	(3) The term "relative" has the meaning given
7	that term in section 3110(a) of title 5, United
8	States Code
