A BILL

- To establish a national, toll-free telephone parent helpline to provide information and assistance to parents and caregivers of children to prevent child abuse and strengthen families.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National Parent5 Helpline Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds as follows:

1 (1) There are approximately 149,000,000 par-2 ents and caregivers in the United States. 3 (2) Many parents and caregivers do not always 4 have immediate access to a caring and supportive 5 person to help them address various challenges with 6 their children. 7 (3) Parents and caregivers could benefit from 8 an effective helpline that fosters the strengths par-9 ents have, which would improve family and peer re-10 lationships, as well as community life and society 11 overall. 12 (4) Congress recognizes that helpline prevention 13 services will empower parents and caregivers to posi-14 tively address child care issues and help address 15 child maltreatment, drug and alcohol problems, men-16 tal health, and personal growth and development. 17 SEC. 3. GRANT TO ESTABLISH A NATIONAL PARENT 18 HELPLINE. 19 Title I of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (42 U.S.C. 5101 et seq.) is amended by inserting after 20 21 section 103 the following: 22 "SEC. 103A. GRANT TO ESTABLISH A NATIONAL PARENT 23 HELPLINE. "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may award a 24 grant to one or more nonprofit entities to-25

"(1) provide for the establishment and ongoing
 operation of a national, toll-free telephone parent
 helpline to provide information and assistance to
 parents and caregivers to prevent child abuse and
 strengthen families; and

6 "(2) create and maintain an Internet website 7 with vital information and resources for parents and 8 caregivers to address a broad spectrum of family 9 issues related to emotional, social, behavioral, and 10 educational well-being of parents and children.

11 "(b) PRIORITY.—In awarding the grant under this 12 section, the Secretary shall give priority to entities with 13 experience in operating a national parent helpline that 14 provides assistance to parents and caregivers and that op-15 erates shared leadership groups for parents and children 16 nationwide.

17 "(c) TERM.—A grant awarded under this section may18 be for a period of not more than 5 years.

"(d) HELPLINE ACTIVITIES.—An entity that receives
a grant under this section shall use the grant funds to
establish and operate a 24-hour, national, toll-free telephone helpline to provide—

23 "(1) information and assistance to parents and24 caregivers who are facing parenting challenges; and

"(2) a link to needed resources, with a focus on
 weekly shared leadership groups available nation wide.

"(e) REPORTS AND EVALUATION.—The entity receiv-4 5 ing a grant under this section shall submit a performance report to the Secretary at such time as shall be reasonably 6 7 required by the Secretary. Such performance report shall 8 describe the activities that have been carried out with the grant funds, contain an evaluation of the effectiveness of 9 such activities, and provide such additional information as 10 11 the Secretary may reasonably require. In the case that 12 more than 1 entities are awarded a grant under this sec-13 tion, such entities shall collaborate to prepare and submit a joint report as described in this subsection.". 14

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
