3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN TAMPER RESISTANT GROUND FAULT**

4 **CIRCUIT INTERRUPTER RECEPTACLES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter Receptacles with protective internal shutter to prevent insertion of foreign objects thereby giving the GFCI receptacle the property of being ‘tamper resistant’, clearly marked TR on receptacle face plate, meeting the 2008 National Electric Code Section 406.11, for 15 A or 20 A (provided for in sub-heading 8536.30.80)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2011”.

1 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
 2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
 4 the date of the enactment of this Act.
