3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring All Students

5 Year-round (EASY) Access to Meals and Snacks Act".

6 SEC. 2. YEAR-ROUND SERVICES FOR ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.

7 Section 13(a) of the Richard B. Russell National
8 School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1761(a)) is amended by add9 ing at the end the following—

10 "(11) YEAR-ROUND OPTION.—

1	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in
2	subparagraph (B), a service institution that is
3	described in paragraph (6) (excluding a public
4	school), or a private nonprofit organization de-
5	scribed in paragraph (7), shall be eligible for
6	the program under the same terms and condi-
7	tions as other service institutions.
8	"(B) Reimbursement exception.—A
9	service institution described in subparagraph
10	(A), in addition to being eligible for reimburse-
11	ment for meals described in subsection $(b)(2)$
12	served during each day of operation during the
13	periods described in subsection $(c)(1)$, may be
14	reimbursed for up to 1 meal and 1 snack per
15	child served during each day of operation dur-

17	"(i) after school hours;
18	"(ii) weekends; and
