Mr. MANCHIN (for himself and Mr. UDALL) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To establish a presumption that certain firefighters who are Federal employees and have COVID–19 contracted that disease while in the performance of their official duties, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “COVID–19 as a Pre-
5 sumptive Disease in Wildland Firefighters Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. COVID–19 AND FEDERAL FIREFIGHTERS.**

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1 (1) FIRE SEASON.—The term “fire season”
2 means the period beginning on May 15, 2020, and
3 ending on November 15, 2020.

4 (2) FIREFIGHTER.—The term “firefighter”
5 means an employee, as that term is defined in sec-
6 tion 8101 of title 5, United States Code, who—

7 (A) possesses a certification that qualifies
8 the individual to work on a wildland fire inci-
9 dent (commonly known as an “Incident Quali-
10 fication Card”); and

11 (B)(i) occupies a position that identifies
12 wildland firefighting as a primary job duty; or
13 (ii) has been deployed to a wildland fire in-
14 cident, as documented in—

15 (I) a resource order; or
16 (II) the Interagency Resource Order-
17 ing Capability system administered by the
18 Secretary of Agriculture or the Secretary
19 of the Interior.

20 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
21 the Secretary of Labor, acting through the Director
22 of the Office of Workers’ Compensation Programs of
23 the Department of Labor.

24 (4) WILDLAND FIRE INCIDENT.—The term
25 “wildland fire incident” means a wildfire that—

8 (b) PRE-WORK TESTING.—

13 (A) is tested for—

(i) COVID-19; or

15 (ii) symptoms of COVID-19; or

21 (2) TIMING OF ACTION.—The Secretary of the
22 Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture shall take
23 the applicable action required under paragraph
24 (1)—

(A) with respect to a firefighter described
in subsection (a)(2)(B)(i)—

(ii) before the firefighter performs any work as a firefighter during the fire season; and

(B) with respect to a firefighter described in subsection (a)(2)(B)(ii), before the firefighter performs any work as a firefighter during a wildland fire incident.

12 (c) COMPENSATION FOR WORK INJURIES.—

18 (2) ELIGIBILITY.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—A firefighter is de-
20 scribed in this paragraph if—

(i)(I) the firefighter records at a wildland fire incident, duty station, or medical facility—

(aa) a fever of not less than

100.5 degrees Fahrenheit, as meas-

ured with a thermometer; and

(bb) a blood-oxygen saturation

level of less than 94 percent, as meas-

ured with a pulse oximeter;

(II) a qualified physician issues a

written opinion that the firefighter likely

has COVID-19; or

(III) the firefighter has a positive

COVID-19 test result; and

(ii) the qualifying event with respect to the

firefighter under clause (i) occurs—

(I) with respect to a firefighter de-

scribed in subsection (a)(2)(B)(i), during

the period beginning on the date on which

the fire season begins and ending on the

date that is 28 days after the

ch the fire season ends; and

(II) with respect to a firefighter de-

scribed in subsection (a)(2)(B)(ii), during

the period beginning on the date on which

the firefighter is deployed to the applicable

wildland fire incident and ending on the

date that is 28 days after the date on
which that deployment ends.

6 (i) research COVID-19 detection
7 methods; and

(4) PERIOD OF DISABILITY.—The period of disability with respect to a firefighter to whom the presumption under paragraph (1) applies shall be determined in accordance with subchapter I of chapter 81 of title 5, United States Code, and the rules issued under that subchapter.

24 (d) CLAIMS.—The Secretary may waive or modify the
25 requirements under any of paragraphs (1) through (6) of

1 section 8121 of title 5, United States Code, with respect
2 to a firefighter to whom the presumption under subsection
3 (c)(1) applies if the Secretary determines that such waiver
4 or modification is necessary or appropriate in carrying out
5 this section.

6 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF PROCEDURES.—The Sec-
7 retary shall expedite, to the maximum extent practicable,
8 authorization for the furnishing of medical procedures and
9 for bill processing relating to treatment of COVID–19 for
10 a firefighter to whom the presumption under subsection
11 (c)(1) applies.
