# A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to authorize advance appropriations for certain medical care accounts of the

Department of Veterans Affairs by providing two-fiscal year budget authority, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Health Care
- 5 Budget Reform and Transparency Act of 2009".

### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 7 Congress makes the following findings:
- 8 (1) Title 38, United States Code, authorizes the
- 9 Secretary of Veterans Affairs to furnish hospital and
- domiciliary care, medical services, nursing home
- care, and related services to eligible and enrolled vet-
- erans, but only to the extent that appropriated re-
- sources and facilities are available for such purposes.
- 14 (2) For 19 of the past 22 fiscal years, funds
- have not been appropriated for the Department of
- Veterans Affairs for the provision of health care as
- of the commencement of the new fiscal year, causing
- the Department great challenges in planning and
- managing care for enrolled veterans, to the det-
- riment of veterans.
- 21 (3) The cumulative effect of insufficient, late,
- and unpredictable funding for the Department for
- health care endangers the viability of the health care
- system of the Department and impairs the special-

- ized health care resources the Department requires
  to maintain and improve the health of sick and disabled veterans.
  - (4) Appropriations for the health care programs of the Department have too often proven insufficient over the past decade, requiring the Secretary to ration health care and Congress to approve supplemental appropriations for those programs.
  - (5) Providing sufficient, timely, and predictable funding would ensure the Government meets its obligation to provide health care to sick and disabled veterans and ensure that all veterans enrolled for health care through the Department have ready access to timely and high quality care.
  - (6) Providing sufficient, timely, and predictable funding would allow the Department to properly plan for and meet the needs of veterans.

- 19 TAIN MEDICAL CARE ACCOUNTS OF THE DE-
- 20 PARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
- 21 (a) Two-fiscal Year Budget Authority.—
- 22 (1) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 1 of title 38, United 23 States Code, is amended by inserting after section
- 24 113 the following new section:

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"§ 113A. Two-fiscal year budget authority for certain

### 2 medical care accounts "(a) IN GENERAL.—Beginning with fiscal year 2011, 3 new discretionary budget authority provided in an appro-4 5 priations Act for the appropriations accounts of the Department specified in subsection (b) shall be made avail-7 able for the fiscal year involved, and shall include new discretionary budget authority for such appropriations ac-8 9 counts that first become available for the first fiscal year 10 after such fiscal year. 11 "(b) Medical Care Accounts.—The medical care 12 accounts of the Department specified in this subsection 13 are the medical care accounts of the Veterans Health Ad-14 ministration as follows: 15 "(1) Medical Services. "(2) Medical Support and Compliance. 16 17 "(3) Medical Facilities.". 18 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-19 tions at the beginning of chapter 1 of such title is 20 amended by inserting after the item relating to sec-21 tion 113 the following new item:

7	LINE MODEL PROJECTIONS.—The Comptroller General of					
8	the United States shall conduct a study of the adequacy					
9	and accuracy of the budget projections made by the En-					
10	rollee Health Care Projection Model, its equivalent, or					
11	other methodologies, as utilized for the purpose of esti-					
12	mating and projecting health care expenditures of the De-					
13	partment of Veterans Affairs (in this section referred to					
14	as the "Model") with respect to the fiscal year involved					
15	and the subsequent four fiscal years.					
16	(b) Reports.—					
17	(1) In general.—Not later than the date of					
18	each year in 2011, 2012, and 2013, on which the					
19	President submits the budget request for the nex					
20	fiscal year under section 1105 of title 31, United					
21	States Code, the Comptroller General shall submit to					
22	the appropriate committees of Congress and to the					
23	Secretary a report.					
24	(2) Elements.—Each report under this para-					
25	graph shall include, for the fiscal year beginning in					

1	the year in which such report is submitted, the fol-
2	lowing:
3	(A) A statement whether the amount re-
4	quested in the budget of the President for ex-
5	penditures of the Department for health care in
6	such fiscal year is consistent with anticipated
7	expenditures of the Department for health care
8	in such fiscal year as determined utilizing the
9	Model.
10	(B) The basis for such statement.
11	(C) Such additional information as the
12	Comptroller General determines appropriate.
13	(3) Availability to the public.—Each re-
14	port submitted under this subsection shall also be
15	made available to the public.
16	(4) Appropriate committees of congress
17	DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term "appro-
18	priate committees of Congress" means—
19	(A) the Committees on Veterans' Affairs,
20	Appropriations, and the Budget of the Senate;
21	and
22	(B) the Committees on Veterans' Affairs,
23	Appropriations, and the Budget of the House of
24	Representatives.

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
