## A BILL

To amend the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 to modify the definition of the term “biobased product”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Forest Products Fair-  
5 ness Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF BIOBASED PRODUCT.**

7 Section 9001 of the Farm Security and Rural Invest-  
8 ment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 8101) is amended—

1 (1) by striking paragraph (4) and inserting the  
2 following:

3 “(4) BIOBASED PRODUCT.—

4 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The term ‘biobased  
5 product’ means a product determined by the  
6 Secretary to be a commercial or industrial prod-  
7 uct (other than food or feed) that is—

8 “(i) composed, in whole or in signifi-  
9 cant part, of biological products, including  
10 renewable domestic agricultural materials  
11 and forestry materials; or

12 “(ii) an intermediate ingredient or  
13 feedstock.

14 “(B) INCLUSION.—The term ‘biobased  
15 product’, with respect to forestry materials, in-  
16 cludes forest products that meet biobased con-  
17 tent requirements, notwithstanding the market  
18 share the product holds, the age of the product,  
19 or whether the market for the product is new  
20 or emerging.”;

21 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (9) through  
22 (14) as paragraphs (10) through (15), respectively;  
23 and

24 (3) by inserting after paragraph (8) the fol-  
25 lowing:

1 “(9) FOREST PRODUCT.—

2 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The term ‘forest prod-  
3 uct’ means a product made from materials de-  
4 rived from the practice of forestry or the man-  
5 agement of growing timber.

6 “(B) INCLUSIONS.—The term ‘forest prod-  
7 uct’ includes—

8 “(i) pulp, paper, paperboard, pellets,  
9 lumber, and other wood products; and

10 “(ii) any recycled products derived  
11 from forest materials.”.
