A BILL

- To expand the boundaries of the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Thunder Bay National
3 Marine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve Boundary
4 Modification Act".

5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find7 ings:

8 (1) Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary
9 and Underwater Preserve in Lake Huron contains
10 more than 100 recorded historic vessel losses.

(2) The areas immediately surrounding the
 Sanctuary, including the offshore waters of Presque
 Isle and Alcona counties, Michigan, contain an equal
 number of historic vessel losses.

15 (3) Many of these shipwrecks and underwater
16 eultural resources are popular recreational diving
17 destinations and all contribute to our collective mari18 time heritage.

19 (4) These resources are susceptible to damage
20 from human activities and must be properly pre21 served for their innate value and to protect the eco22 nomic viability of their contribution to national and
23 regional economies.

24 (b) <u>PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are</u>—

25 (1) to expand the Thunder Bay National Ma26 rine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve boundaries
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1	to encompass the offshore waters of Presque Isle
2	and Alcona counties, Michigan, and outward to the
3	international border between the United States and
4	Canada; and
5	(2) to provide the underwater cultural resources
6	of those areas equal protection to that currently af-
7	forded to the Sanctuary.
8	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
9	In this Act:
10	(1) SANCTUARY.—The term "Sanctuary"
11	means the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary
12	and Underwater Preserve.
13	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
14	the Secretary of Commerce.
15	SEC. 4. SANCTUARY BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT.
16	(a) Boundary Adjustment.—Notwithstanding any
17	other provision of law, including section 922.190 of title
18	15, Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on the date
19	of the enactment of this Act, the Sanctuary shall consist
20	of the geographic area described in subsection (b).
21	(b) Expanded Sanctuary Boundary.—The area
22	referred to in subsection (a) is all submerged lands, in-
23	eluding the underwater cultural resources, lakeward of the
24	mean high water line, within the boundaries of a line
25	formed by connecting points in succession beginning at a

1 point along the mean high water line located approximately at 45.6262N, 84.2043W at the intersection of the 2 northern Presque Isle and northeastern Cheboygan Coun-3 4 ty boundary, then north to a point approximately 5 45.7523N, 84.2011W, then northeast to a point approximately 45.7777N, 84.1231W, then due east to the inter-6 7 national boundary between the United States and Canada 8 approximately located at 45.7719N, 83.4840W then fol-9 lowing the international boundary between the United 10 States and Canada in a generally southeasterly direction to a point located approximately at 44.5128N, 82.3295W, 11 12 then due west to a point along the mean high water line located approximately at 44.5116N, 83.3186W at the 13 intersection of the southern Alcona County and northern 14 Iosco County boundary, returning to the first point along 15 the mean high water line. 16

17 (c) AUTHORITY TO MAKE MINOR ADJUSTMENTS.
18 The Secretary may make minor adjustments to the bound19 ary described in subsection (b) to facilitate enforcement
20 and elarify the boundary to the public if the resulting
21 boundary is consistent with the purposes described in sec22 tion 2(b).

23 (d) INCLUSION IN THE NATIONAL MARINE SANC24 TUARY SYSTEM.—The area described in subsection (b), as
25 modified in accordance with subsection (c), shall be man-

aged as part of the National Marine Sanctuary System
 established by section 301(c) of the National Marine Sanc tuaries Act (16 U.S.C. 1431(c)), in accordance with that
 Act.

5 (e) UPDATED NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOS-6 PHERIC ADMINISTRATION CHARTS.—The Secretary 7 shall—

8 (1) produce updated National Oceanic and At9 mospheric Administration charts for the area in
10 which the Sanctuary is located; and

(2) include on such charts the boundaries of the
 Sanctuary described in subsection (b), as modified in
 accordance with subsection (c).

14 SEC. 5. EXTENSION OF REGULATIONS AND MANAGEMENT.

(a) REGULATIONS. The regulations applicable to
the Sanctuary codified in subpart R of part 922 of title
15, Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on the date
of the enactment of this Act, shall apply to the geographic
area added to the Sanctuary pursuant to section 4, unless
the Secretary specifies otherwise by regulation.

(b) EXISTING CERTIFICATIONS.—The Secretary may
certify that any license, permit, approval, other authorization, or right to conduct a prohibited activity authorized
pursuant to section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal
Regulations, that exists on the date of the enactment of

this Act shall apply to such an activity conducted within
 the geographic area added to the Sanctuary pursuant to
 section 4.

4 (c) DATE OF SANCTUARY DESIGNATION.—For pur5 poses of section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal Regu6 lations, the date of Sanctuary designation shall be the date
7 of the enactment of this Act.

8 (d) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—To the extent practicable, 9 the Secretary shall apply the management plan in effect 10 for the Sanctuary on the date of the enactment of this 11 Act to the geographic area added to the Sanctuary pursu-12 ant to section 4.

13 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

5 other provision of law, including section 922.190 of title
6 15, Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on the date
7 of the enactment of this Act, the Sanctuary shall consist
8 of the geographic area described in subsection (b).

9 (b) EXPANDED SANCTUARY BOUNDARY.—The area re-10 ferred to in subsection (a) is all submerged lands, including the underwater cultural resources, lakeward of the mean 11 high water line, within the boundaries of a line formed by 12 connecting points in succession beginning at a point along 13 the mean high water line located approximately at 14 15 45.6262N, 84.2043W at the intersection of the northern Presque Isle and northeastern Cheboygan County boundary, 16 then north to a point approximately 45.7523N, 84.2011W, 17 18 then northeast to a point approximately 45.7777N, 84.1231W, then due east to the international boundary be-19 tween the United States and Canada approximately located 20 21 at 45.7719N, 83.4840W then following the international 22 boundary between the United States and Canada in a gen-23 erally southeasterly direction to a point located approxi-24 mately at 44.5128N, 82.3295W, then due west to a point 25 along the mean high water line located approximately at

- 20 (2) include on such charts the boundaries of the
 21 Sanctuary described in subsection (b), as modified in
 22 accordance with subsection (c).

23 SEC. 5. EXTENSION OF REGULATIONS AND MANAGEMENT.

24 (a) REGULATIONS.—The regulations applicable to the
25 Sanctuary codified in subpart R of part 922 of title 15,

Alcona County and northern Iosco County boundary, re-

turning to the first point along the mean high water line.

Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on the date of the
 enactment of this Act, shall apply to the geographic area
 added to the Sanctuary pursuant to section 4, unless the
 Secretary specifies otherwise by regulation.

5 (b) EXISTING CERTIFICATIONS.—The Secretary may 6 certify that any license, permit, approval, other authoriza-7 tion, or right to conduct a prohibited activity authorized 8 pursuant to section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal Reg-9 ulations, that exists on the date of the enactment of this 10 Act shall apply to such an activity conducted within the 11 geographic area added to the Sanctuary pursuant to section 12 4.

(c) DATE OF SANCTUARY DESIGNATION.—For purposes of section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, the date of Sanctuary designation shall be the date
of the enactment of this Act.

(d) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—To the extent practicable,
18 the Secretary shall apply the management plan in effect
19 for the Sanctuary on the date of the enactment of this Act
20 to the geographic area added to the Sanctuary pursuant
21 to section 4.

22 SEC. 6. CONSTRUCTION.

Nothing in this Act may be construed to increase or
require an increase of the amount of appropriated funds
