A BILL

To repeal the Defense of Marriage Act and ensure respect for State regulation of marriage.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Respect for Marriage

5 Act of 2011".

1SEC. 2. REPEAL OF SECTION ADDED TO TITLE 28, UNITED2STATES CODE, BY SECTION 2 OF THE DE-3FENSE OF MARRIAGE ACT.

4 Section 1738C of title 28, United States Code, is re5 pealed, and the table of sections at the beginning of chap6 ter 115 of title 28, United States Code, is amended by
7 striking the item relating to that section.

8 SEC. 3. MARRIAGE RECOGNITION.

9 Section 7 of title 1, United States Code, is amended10 to read as follows:

11 **"§7. Marriage**

12 "(a) For the purposes of any Federal law in which 13 marital status is a factor, an individual shall be considered 14 married if that individual's marriage is valid in the State 15 where the marriage was entered into or, in the case of 16 a marriage entered into outside any State, if the marriage 17 is valid in the place where entered into and the marriage 18 could have been entered into in a State.

"(b) In this section, the term 'State' means a State,
the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto
Rico, or any other territory or possession of the United
States.".
