Mr. COTTON (for himself and Mr. JONES) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to provide for the inclusion of homeschooled students in Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps units.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. INCLUSION OF HOMESCHOOLED STUDENTS IN**
4 **JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICER'S TRAINING**
5 **CORPS UNITS.**

6 Section 2031 of title 10, United States Code, is
7 amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
8 section:

9 “(g)(1) Each public secondary educational institution
10 that maintains a unit under this section shall permit mem-

1 bership in the unit to homeschooled students residing in
2 the area served by the institution who are qualified for
3 membership in the unit (but for lack of enrollment in the
4 institution).

5 “(2) A student who is a member of a unit pursuant
6 to this subsection shall count toward the satisfaction by
7 the institution concerned of the requirement in subsection
8 (b)(1) relating to the minimum number of student mem-
9 bers in the unit necessary for the continuing maintenance
10 of the unit.”.

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
