Mr. KENNEDY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation

## A BILL

To prohibit the collection of data or information generated on the internet.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** 

4 This Act may be cited as the "Own Your Own Data5 Act".

6 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION GEN7 ERATED ON INTERNET.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Each individual owns and has an 9 exclusive property right in the data that an individual gen-10 erates on the internet under section 5 of the Federal 11 Trade Commission Act (15 U.S.C. 45). 1 (b) Social Media Companies.—

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2 (1) IN GENERAL.—Each social media company
3 shall—

(A) have a prominently and conspicuously displayed icon each user may click to obtain a copy of the user's data with any analysis of the user's data performed by the social media company;

9 (B) have a prominently and conspicuously 10 displayed icon each user may click to easily ex-11 port the user's data with any analysis of the 12 user's data performed by the social media com-13 pany;

14 (C) require that each user, during the reg15 istration of an account, knowingly and willfully
16 enter into a licensing agreement—

(i) that uses plain language that a
reasonable person of average intelligence
can understand the first time the person
reads or hears the licensing agreement;
(ii) in which the user agrees to license

the user's data to the social media company; and

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1	(iii) that is no longer than 500 words,
2	using a measure of 6 characters to a word;
3	and
4	(D) have an icon each user may click to
5	cancel immediately the license agreement.
6	(2) REGULATIONS.—The Federal Trade Com-
7	mission shall promulgate regulations carrying out
8	this subsection, which shall be approved by Con-
9	gress.
10	(c) ENFORCEMENT.—The Federal Trade Commission
11	shall enforce the provisions of this Act.

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
