AN ACT

- To provide support for law enforcement agency efforts to protect the mental health and well-being of law enforcement officers, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Law Enforcement3 Mental Health and Wellness Act of 2017".

4 SEC. 2. SUPPORT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.

5 (a) INTERAGENCY COLLABORATION.—The Attorney General shall consult with the Secretary of Defense and 6 7 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to submit to Congress 8 a report, which shall be made publicly available, on De-9 partment of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs 10 mental health practices and services that could be adopted 11 by Federal, State, local, or tribal law enforcement agen-12 cies.

(b) CASE STUDIES.—The Director of the Office of
14 Community Oriented Policing Services shall submit to
15 Congress a report—

(1) that is similar to the report entitled
"Health, Safety, and Wellness Program Case Studies in Law Enforcement" published by the Office of
Community Oriented Policing Services in 2015; and
(2) that focuses on case studies of programs designed primarily to address officer psychological
health and well-being.

(c) PEER MENTORING PILOT PROGRAM.—Section
1701(b) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets
Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796dd(b)) is amended—

(1) in paragraph (21), by striking "; and" and 1 2 inserting a semicolon; 3 (2) in paragraph (22), by striking the period at the end and inserting "; and"; and 4 5 (3) by adding at the end the following: 6 "(23) to establish peer mentoring mental health 7 and wellness pilot programs within State, tribal, and 8 local law enforcement agencies.".

9 SEC. 3. SUPPORT FOR MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS.

10 The Attorney General, in coordination with the Sec-11 retary of Health and Human Services, shall develop re-12 sources to educate mental health providers about the cul-13 ture of Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforcement 14 agencies and evidence-based therapies for mental health 15 issues common to Federal, State, local, and tribal law en-16 forcement officers.

17 SEC. 4. SUPPORT FOR OFFICERS.

18 The Attorney General shall—

- 19 (1) in consultation with Federal, State, local,
 20 and tribal law enforcement agencies—
- 21 (A) identify and review the effectiveness of
 22 any existing crisis hotlines for law enforcement
 23 officers;
- 24 (B) provide recommendations to Congress25 on whether Federal support for existing crisis

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1	hotlines or the creation of an alternative hotline
2	would improve the effectiveness or use of the
3	hotline; and
4	(C) conduct research into the efficacy of
5	an annual mental health check for law enforce-
6	ment officers;
7	(2) in consultation with the Secretary of Home-
8	land Security and the head of other Federal agencies
9	that employ law enforcement officers, examine the
10	mental health and wellness needs of Federal law en-
11	forcement officers, including the efficacy of expand-
12	ing peer mentoring programs for law enforcement
13	officers at each Federal agency; and
14	(3) ensure that any recommendations, re-
15	sources, or programs provided under this Act protect
16	the privacy of participating law enforcement officers.
