- To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve the provision of services for homeless veterans, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Homeless Veterans

5 Prevention Act of 2019".

1SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF PER DIEM PAYMENTS FOR2FURNISHING CARE TO DEPENDENTS OF CER-3TAIN HOMELESS VETERANS.

4 Subsection (a) of section 2012 of title 38, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol6 lowing new paragraph:

"(4) Services for which a recipient of a grant under
section 2011 of this title (or an entity described in paragraph (1)) may receive per diem payments under this subsection may include furnishing care for a dependent of a
homeless veteran who is under the care of such homeless
veteran while such homeless veteran receives services from
the grant recipient (or entity).".

14 SEC. 3. PARTNERSHIPS WITH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ENTI-

15TIES TO PROVIDE LEGAL SERVICES TO16HOMELESS VETERANS AND VETERANS AT17RISK OF HOMELESSNESS.

18 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 20 of title 38, United
19 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 2022
20 the following new section:

21 "§ 2022A. Partnerships with public and private entities to provide legal services to homeless
veterans and veterans at risk of homelessness

25 "(a) PARTNERSHIPS AUTHORIZED.—Subject to the
26 availability of funds for that purpose, the Secretary shall
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enter into partnerships with public or private entities to
 fund a portion of the general legal services specified in
 subsection (c) that are provided by such entities to home less veterans and veterans at risk of homelessness.

5 "(b) LOCATIONS.—(1) The Secretary shall ensure 6 that, to the extent practicable, partnerships under this sec-7 tion are made with entities equitably distributed across the 8 geographic regions of the United States, including rural 9 communities, tribal lands of the United States, Native 10 Americans, and tribal organizations.

11 "(2) In this subsection, the terms 'Native American'
12 and 'tribal organization' have the meanings given such
13 terms in section 3765 of this title.

14 "(c) LEGAL SERVICES.—Legal services specified in
15 this subsection include legal services provided by public
16 or private entities that address the needs of homeless vet17 erans and veterans at risk of homelessness as follows:

18 "(1) Legal services related to housing, including
19 eviction defense and representation in landlord-ten20 ant cases and foreclosure proceedings.

21 "(2) Legal services related to family law, in22 cluding assistance in court proceedings for family re23 unification, child support, divorce, and estate plan24 ning.

"(3) Legal services related to income support, 1 2 including assistance in obtaining public benefits. 3 "(4) Legal services related to criminal defense, 4 including defense in matters symptomatic of home-5 lessness, such as outstanding warrants, fines, and 6 driver's license revocation, to reduce recidivism and 7 facilitate the overcoming of reentry obstacles in em-8 ployment or housing. 9 "(5) Such other legal services as the Secretary 10 considers appropriate and necessary. 11 "(d) CONSULTATION.—In developing and carrying 12 out partnerships under this section, the Secretary shall, to the extent practicable, consult with public and private 13 14 entities-15 "(1) for assistance in identifying and contacting 16 organizations described in subsection (c); and 17 "(2) to coordinate appropriate outreach rela-18 tionships with such organizations. 19 "(e) REPORTS.—The Secretary may require entities 20 that have entered into partnerships under this section to 21 submit to the Secretary periodic reports on legal services 22 provided to homeless veterans and veterans at risk of 23 homelessness pursuant to such partnerships.". date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
of the United States shall complete a study of programs
of the Department of Veterans Affairs that provide assistance to homeless veterans.

20 (b) ELEMENTS.—The study required by subsection21 (a) shall include the following:

(1) An assessment of whether programs described in subsection (a) are meeting the needs of
veterans who are eligible for assistance provided by
such programs.

(2) A review of recent efforts of the Secretary
 of Veterans Affairs to improve the privacy, safety,
 and security of female veterans receiving assistance
 from such programs.

5 SEC. 8. REPEAL OF REQUIREMENT FOR ANNUAL REPORTS 6 ON ASSISTANCE TO HOMELESS VETERANS.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2065 of title 38, United8 States Code, is hereby repealed.
