Designating May 2013 as “Older Americans Month”.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

MAY 9, 2013

Mr. NELSON (for himself, Ms. COLLINS, Mr. SANDERS, and Mr. COONS)
submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

Designating May 2013 as “Older Americans Month”.

Whereas President John F. Kennedy first designated May as
“Senior Citizens Month” in 1963;

Whereas, in 1963, only 17,000,000 living people in the
United States had reached their 65th birthday, approxi-
mately $\frac{1}{3}$ of older people in the United States lived in
poverty, and there were few programs to meet the needs
of older people in the United States;

Whereas, as of 2013, there are more than 41,000,000 people
in the United States who are 65 years of age or older;

Whereas, as of 2013, there are more than 9,000,000 veterans
of the Armed Forces who are 65 years of age or older;

Whereas older people in the United States rely on Federal
programs such as Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid,
and, in the case of veterans, TRICARE and the health

care system of the Department of Veterans Affairs, for financial security and high-quality, affordable health care;

Whereas the Older Americans Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C. 3001 et seq.) provides federally funded community-based social services and nutritional support programs to nearly 2,600,000 older people in the United States each year;

Whereas many people in the United States are living longer, working longer, and enjoying healthier, more active lifestyles than in past generations;

Whereas older people play an important role by continuing to contribute experience, knowledge, wisdom, and accomplishments;

Whereas older people are active community members involved in volunteering, mentorship, arts and culture, and civic engagement; and

Whereas recognizing the successes of older people in the community encourages ongoing participation and further accomplishments: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate—

2 (1) designates May 2013 as “Older Americans
3 Month”;

4 (2) recognizes May 2013 as the 50th anniversary of “Older Americans Month”; and

5 (3) encourages the people of the United States
6 to provide opportunities for older people to continue
7 to flourish by—
8

1 (A) emphasizing the importance of older
2 people and their leadership by publicly recog-
3 nizing their continued achievements;

4 (B) presenting opportunities for older peo-
5 ple to share their wisdom, experience, and
6 skills; and

7 (C) recognizing older people as a valuable
8 asset in strengthening the communities of the
9 United States.

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
