Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on Intelligence.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. WARNER, from the Select Committee on Intelligence, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on
Intelligence.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORITY.**

3 In carrying out its powers, duties, and functions
4 under Senate Resolution 400 (94th Congress), agreed to
5 May 19, 1976, in accordance with its jurisdiction under
6 sections 3(a) and 17 of such Senate Resolution, including
7 holding hearings, reporting such hearings, and making in-
8 vestigations as authorized by section 5 of such Senate Res-
9 olution, the Select Committee on Intelligence (in this reso-
10 lution referred to as the “committee”) is authorized from

1 March 1, 2023, through February 28, 2025, in its discre-
2 tion, to—

3 (1) make expenditures from the contingent fund
4 of the Senate;

5 (2) employ personnel; and

6 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
7 department or agency concerned and the Committee
8 on Rules and Administration, use on a reimbursable
9 or nonreimbursable basis the services of personnel of
10 any such department or agency.

11 **SEC. 2. EXPENSES.**

12 (a) EXPENSES FOR PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30,
13 2023.—The expenses of the committee for the period
14 March 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023, under this
15 resolution shall not exceed \$4,963,676, of which amount
16 not to exceed \$10,000 may be expended for the procure-
17 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
18 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
19 lative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

20 (b) EXPENSES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024 PERIOD.—

21 The expenses of the committee for the period October 1,
22 2023, through September 30, 2024, under this resolution
23 shall not exceed \$8,509,160, of which amount not to ex-
24 ceed \$17,144 may be expended for the procurement of the
25 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof

1 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
2 nization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

3 (c) EXPENSES FOR PERIOD ENDING FEBRUARY 28,
4 2025.—The expenses of the committee for the period Oc-
5 tober 1, 2024, through February 28, 2025, under this res-
6 olution shall not exceed \$3,545,483, of which amount not
7 to exceed \$7,143 may be expended for the procurement
8 of the services of individual consultants, or organizations
9 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
10 Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i))).

11 **SEC. 3. EXPENSES AND AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.**

12 (a) EXPENSES OF THE COMMITTEE.—

13 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
14 graph (2), expenses of the committee under this res-
15 olution shall be paid from the contingent fund of the
16 Senate upon vouchers approved by the chairman of
17 the committee.

18 (2) VOUCHERS NOT REQUIRED.—Vouchers shall
19 not be required for—

20 (A) the disbursement of salaries of employ-
21 ees paid at an annual rate;

22 (B) the payment of telecommunications
23 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms
24 and Doorkeeper;

12 (b) AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.—There are authorized
13 to be paid from the appropriations account for “Expenses
14 of Inquiries and Investigations” of the Senate such sums
15 as may be necessary for agency contributions related to
16 the compensation of employees of the committee—

(3) for the period October 1, 2024, through February 28, 2025.
