LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies provisions of the Cosmetology and Associated Professions Licensing Act.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ provides that certain licensed cosmetology and associated professions schools may offer 50% of their instruction online;
- ▶ provides a sunset date; and
- ▶ makes technical changes.

This bill provides a special effective date.

78 Section 3. **Effective date.**

79 If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
80 upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
81 Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
82 the date of veto override.
