8 **LONG TITLE**

9 **General Description:**

10 This bill appropriates funds for the support and operation of state government for the fiscal
11 year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020.

12 **Highlighted Provisions:**

13 This bill:

- 14 ▶ provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain state agencies
15 and institutions of higher education;
16 ▶ authorizes certain state agency fees;
17 ▶ authorizes internal service fund rates;
18 ▶ adjusts funding for the impact of Internal Service Fund rate changes; and
19 ▶ provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described.

20 **Money Appropriated in this Bill:**

21 This bill appropriates \$5,709,200 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2020,
22 including:

- 23 ▶ (\$1,024,600) from the General Fund;
24 ▶ \$1,902,200 from the Education Fund;
25 ▶ \$4,831,600 from various sources as detailed in this bill.

26 This bill appropriates \$65,200 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2020.

27 This bill appropriates \$1,750,600 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2020, including:

- 28 ▶ \$1,209,800 from the General Fund;
29 ▶ \$540,800 from various sources as detailed in this bill.

30 This bill appropriates \$21,200 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year 2020,
31 including:

- 32 ▶ \$22,200 from the General Fund;
33 ▶ (\$1,000) from various sources as detailed in this bill.

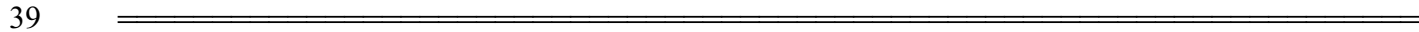
34 This bill appropriates \$36,500 in fiduciary funds for fiscal year 2020.

35 **Other Special Clauses:**

36 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2019.

39 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

40 Section 1. **FY 2020 Appropriations.** The following sums of money are appropriated for
 41 Internal Service Fund rate adjustments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30,
 42 2020. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2020.

43 Subsection 1(a). **Operating and Capital Budgets.** Under the terms and conditions of
 44 Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of
 45 money from the funds or accounts indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of
 46 Utah.
