<u>Whereas</u>, although the 20th century was a pivotal century for women entering politics, they remain underrepresented in this male-dominated field, and providing opportunities to encourage women to serve in public office is imperative, and

<u>Whereas</u>, recognizing women in public office will bring awareness of the fundamental necessity of their work and will inspire young women to serve their communities in this way, and
