SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1360

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2023 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to alternative licensing standards of 2 professional licenses; adding a new section to chapter 43.24 RCW; 3 adding a new chapter to Title 18 RCW; creating a new section; and 4 providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that there are 7 many ways to gain demonstrated competency of skills in a profession. Furthermore, conditions such as educational requirements, course 8 9 fees, and training hours, which an individual must fulfill before 10 receiving a professional license to practice in a profession, create 11 unnecessary barriers to an individual's right to employment if the 12 individual can demonstrate full competency of the skills required of 13 that profession.

14 (2) The legislature also finds that such redundant requirements 15 are likely to discriminate against people of color, low-income 16 individuals, and trained or untrained immigrant populations, who may 17 possess the ability to excel in a profession but lack the ability to 18 readily fulfill the professional licensing requirements to practice.

(3) It is therefore the intent of the legislature to authorize the Washington state department of licensing, after consulting with relevant trade groups, to develop a competency-based assessment which allows individuals to demonstrate proficiency of the knowledge and
 skills otherwise required by a professional licensing examination.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.24
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) The department of licensing may issue a professional license, 6 without regard to other requirements, to an applicant if the 7 applicant meets all competency-based licensing requirements for a 8 specific professional license issued by the department.

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(2) For the purposes of this section:

(a) (i) "Competency-based licensing requirement" means a practical assessment of knowledge and skills that clearly demonstrate a person is prepared to engage in a profession regulated by the department, and which the director of the department of licensing determines is at least as effective as examination-based professional licensing requirements at demonstrating proficiency and protecting the health and safety of the public.

(ii) "Competency-based licensing requirement" may include, but is not limited to, any combination of training, experience, testing, or observation.

20 (b) "Professional license" means a license, certificate, 21 registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by law 22 or a state agency rule that must be obtained by an individual to 23 engage in a profession which is regulated by the department of 24 licensing.

(3) This section does not apply when there is a reciprocity licensing agreement with a national organization in place to facilitate reciprocal professional licensing of an individual licensed in another state.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) The department of licensing may issue 30 a professional license, without regard to other requirements, to an 31 applicant if the applicant meets all competency-based licensing 32 requirements for a specific professional license issued by the 33 department.

34 (2) For the purposes of this section:

35 (a) (i) "Competency-based licensing requirement" means a practical 36 assessment of knowledge and skills that clearly demonstrate a person 37 is prepared to engage in a profession regulated by the department, 38 and which the director of the department of licensing determines is

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1 at least as effective as examination-based professional licensing 2 requirements at demonstrating proficiency and protecting the health 3 and safety of the public.

4 (ii) "Competency-based licensing requirement" may include, but is
5 not limited to, any combination of training, experience, testing, or
6 observation.

7 (b) "Professional license" means a license, certificate, 8 registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by law 9 or a state agency rule that must be obtained by an individual to 10 engage in a profession which is regulated by the department of 11 licensing.

12 (3) This section does not apply when there is a reciprocity 13 licensing agreement with a national organization in place to 14 facilitate reciprocal professional licensing of an individual 15 licensed in another state.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Section 3 of this act constitutes a new 17 chapter in Title 18 RCW.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. This act takes effect March 1, 2025.

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
