SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1893

1 AN ACT Relating to the use of credit cards for purchases of 2 spirits and wine by a purchaser licensed to sell spirits and/or wine 3 for consumption on the licensed premises; and amending RCW 66.28.270.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.28.270 and 2009 c 373 s 11 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) Nothing in this chapter prohibits the use of checks, credit or debit cards, prepaid accounts, electronic funds transfers, and 8 other similar methods as approved by the board, as cash payments for 9 purposes of this title. Electronic ((fund[s])) funds transfers must 10 11 be: $\left(\frac{1}{2}\right)$ (a) Voluntary; $\left(\frac{2}{2}\right)$ (b) conducted pursuant to a prior written agreement of the parties that includes a provision that the 12 13 purchase be initiated by an irrevocable invoice or sale order before 14 the time of delivery; $((\frac{3}{2}))$ (c) initiated by the retailer, importer, or distributor no later than the first 15 manufacturer, 16 business day following delivery; and (((4))) (d) completed as 17 promptly as is reasonably practical, and in no event((τ)) later than 18 five business days following delivery.

19 (2) Any person licensed as a distributor of spirits and/or wine 20 may pass credit card fees on to a purchaser licensed to sell spirits 21 and/or wine for consumption on the licensed premises, if the decision to use a credit card is entirely voluntary and the credit card fees are set out as a separate line item on the distributor's invoice. Nothing in this section requires the use of a credit card by any licensee. The credit card fee authorized under this section may not exceed the actual fee imposed by the credit card issuer.
