1 AN ACT Relating to contracts with community service organizations 2 for public improvements; and amending RCW 35.21.278.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 35.21.278 and 2019 c 352 s 7 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) Without regard to competitive bidding laws for public works, 7 a county, city, town, school district, metropolitan park district, park and recreation district, port district, or park and recreation 8 service area may contract with a chamber of commerce, a service 9 10 organization, a community, youth, or athletic association, or other 11 similar association located and providing service in the immediate 12 neighborhood, for drawing design plans, making improvements to a park, school playground, public square, other public spaces, or port 13 habitat site, installing equipment or artworks, or providing 14 15 maintenance services for such a project, or for a facility or 16 facilities as a community or neighborhood project, or for an 17 environmental justice stewardship or sustainability project, and may 18 reimburse the contracting association its expense. The contracting 19 association may use volunteers to whom no wage or salary compensation 20 is paid in the project and provide the volunteers with clothing or tools; meals or refreshments; accident/injury insurance coverage; and 21

1 reimbursement of their expenses. The consideration to be received by 2 the public entity through the value of the improvements, artworks, equipment, or maintenance shall have a value at least equal to 3 ((three)) two times that of the payment to the contracting 4 association. All payments made by a public entity under the authority 5 6 of this section for all such contracts in any one year shall not 7 exceed twenty-five thousand dollars or two dollars per resident within the boundaries of the public entity, whichever is greater. 8

9 (2) A county, city, town, school district, metropolitan park 10 district, park and recreation district, or park and recreation 11 service area may ratify an agreement, which qualifies under 12 subsection (1) of this section and was made before June 9, 1988.

(3) Without regard to competitive bidding laws for public works, 13 14 a school district, institution of higher education, or other governmental entity that includes training programs for students may 15 16 contract with a community service organization, nonprofit 17 organization, or other similar entity, to build tiny houses for low-18 income housing, if the students participating in the building of the tiny houses are in: 19

(a) Training in a community and technical college construction orconstruction management program;

(b) A career and technical education program;

23 (c) A state-recognized apprenticeship preparation program; or

(d) Training under a construction career exploration program forhigh school students administered by a nonprofit organization.
