AN ACT Relating to educational service district health benefits; amending RCW 41.05.011 and 41.05.050; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 41.05.011 and 2018 c 260 s 4 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 7 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

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(1) "Authority" means the Washington state health care authority.

9 (2) "Board" means the public employees' benefits board 10 established under RCW 41.05.055 and the school employees' benefits 11 board established under RCW 41.05.740.

12 (3) "Dependent care assistance program" means a benefit plan 13 whereby employees and school employees may pay for certain employment 14 related dependent care with pretax dollars as provided in the salary 15 reduction plan under this chapter pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Sec. 129 or 16 other sections of the internal revenue code.

17 (4) "Director" means the director of the authority.

18 (5) "Emergency service personnel killed in the line of duty" 19 means law enforcement officers and firefighters as defined in RCW 20 41.26.030, members of the Washington state patrol retirement fund as 21 defined in RCW 43.43.120, and reserve officers and firefighters as 1 defined in RCW 41.24.010 who die as a result of injuries sustained in 2 the course of employment as determined consistent with Title 51 RCW 3 by the department of labor and industries.

"Employee" for the public employees' benefits board 4 (6) (a) program includes all employees of the state, whether or not covered 5 6 by civil service; elected and appointed officials of the executive branch of government, including full-time members of boards, 7 commissions, or committees; justices of the supreme court and judges 8 of the court of appeals and the superior courts; and members of the 9 state legislature. Pursuant to contractual agreement with the 10 authority, "employee" may also include: (i) Employees of a county, 11 12 municipality, or other political subdivision of the state and members of the legislative authority of any county, city, or town who are 13 elected to office after February 20, 1970, if the 14 legislative 15 authority of the county, municipality, or other political subdivision 16 of the state submits application materials to the authority to 17 provide any of its insurance programs by contract with the authority, 18 as provided in RCW 41.04.205 and 41.05.021(1)(g); (ii) employees of 19 employee organizations representing state civil service employees, at the option of each such employee organization; (iii) through December 20 21 31, 2019, employees of a school district if the authority agrees to 22 provide any of the school districts' insurance programs by contract 23 with the authority as provided in RCW 28A.400.350; (iv) employees of a tribal government, if the governing body of the tribal government 24 25 seeks and receives the approval of the authority to provide any of 26 its insurance programs by contract with the authority, as provided in 27 RCW 41.05.021(1) (f) and (g); (v) employees of the Washington health 28 benefit exchange if the governing board of the exchange established 29 in RCW 43.71.020 seeks and receives approval of the authority to 30 provide any of its insurance programs by contract with the authority, 31 as provided in RCW 41.05.021(1) (g) and (n); and (vi) through December 31, 2019, employees of a charter school established under 32 chapter 28A.710 RCW. "Employee" does not include: Adult family home 33 providers; unpaid volunteers; patients of state hospitals; inmates; 34 employees of the Washington state convention and trade center as 35 RCW 41.05.110; students of institutions of higher 36 provided in 37 education as determined by their institution; and any others not expressly defined as employees under this chapter or by the authority 38 39 under this chapter.

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(b) Effective January 1, 2020, "school employee" for the school
employees' benefits board program includes:

3 <u>(i) All employees of school districts((, educational service</u> 4 districts,)) and charter schools established under chapter 28A.710 5 RCW;

6 (ii) Represented employees of educational service districts; and

7 (iii) Effective January 1, 2024, all employees of educational 8 service districts.

9 (7) "Employee group" means employees of a similar employment 10 type, such as administrative, represented classified, nonrepresented 11 classified <u>excluding such employees in educational service districts</u> 12 <u>until December 31, 2023</u>, confidential, represented certificated, or 13 nonrepresented certificated <u>excluding such employees in educational</u> 14 <u>service districts until December 31, 2023</u>, within a school employees' 15 benefits board organization.

16 (8)(a) "Employer" for the public employees' benefits board 17 program means the state of Washington.

(b) "Employer" for the school employees' benefits board program means school districts and educational service districts and charter schools established under chapter 28A.710 RCW.

(9) "Employer group" means those counties, municipalities, 21 political subdivisions, the Washington health benefit exchange, 22 tribal governments, employee organizations representing state civil 23 service employees, and through December 31, 2019, school districts, 24 25 educational service districts, and charter schools obtaining employee benefits through a contractual agreement with the authority to 26 participate in benefit plans developed by the public employees' 27 28 benefits board.

(10) (a) "Employing agency" for the public employees' benefits board program means a division, department, or separate agency of state government, including an institution of higher education; a county, municipality, or other political subdivision; and a tribal government covered by this chapter.

34 (b) "Employing agency" for the school employees' benefits board 35 program means school districts, educational service districts, and 36 charter schools.

37 (11) "Faculty" means an academic employee of an institution of 38 higher education whose workload is not defined by work hours but 39 whose appointment, workload, and duties directly serve the 40 institution's academic mission, as determined under the authority of

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its enabling statutes, its governing body, and any applicable
collective bargaining agreement.

3 (12) "Flexible benefit plan" means a benefit plan that allows 4 employees and school employees to choose the level of health care 5 coverage provided and the amount of employee or school employee 6 contributions from among a range of choices offered by the authority.

7 (13) "Insuring entity" means an insurer as defined in chapter 8 48.01 RCW, a health care service contractor as defined in chapter 9 48.44 RCW, or a health maintenance organization as defined in chapter 10 48.46 RCW.

(14) "Medical flexible spending arrangement" means a benefit plan whereby state and school employees may reduce their salary before taxes to pay for medical expenses not reimbursed by insurance as provided in the salary reduction plan under this chapter pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Sec. 125 or other sections of the internal revenue code.

16 (15) "Participant" means an individual who fulfills the 17 eligibility and enrollment requirements under the salary reduction 18 plan.

19 (16) "Plan year" means the time period established by the 20 authority.

(17) "Premium payment plan" means a benefit plan whereby public employees may pay their share of group health plan premiums with pretax dollars as provided in the salary reduction plan under this chapter pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Sec. 125 or other sections of the internal revenue code.

26 (18) "Public employee" has the same meaning as employee and 27 school employee.

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(19) "Retired or disabled school employee" means:

(a) Persons who separated from employment with a school district
or educational service district and are receiving a retirement
allowance under chapter 41.32 or 41.40 RCW as of September 30, 1993;

32 (b) Persons who separate from employment with a school district, 33 educational service district, or charter school on or after October 34 1, 1993, and immediately upon separation receive a retirement 35 allowance under chapter 41.32, 41.35, or 41.40 RCW;

36 (c) Persons who separate from employment with a school district, 37 educational service district, or charter school due to a total and 38 permanent disability, and are eligible to receive a deferred 39 retirement allowance under chapter 41.32, 41.35, or 41.40 RCW. (20) "Salary" means a state or school employee's monthly salary
or wages.

3 (21) "Salary reduction plan" means a benefit plan whereby public 4 employees may agree to a reduction of salary on a pretax basis to 5 participate in the dependent care assistance program, medical 6 flexible spending arrangement, or premium payment plan offered 7 pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Sec. 125 or other sections of the internal 8 revenue code.

9 (22) "School employees' benefits board organization" means a 10 public school district or educational service district or charter 11 school established under chapter 28A.710 RCW that is required to 12 participate in benefit plans provided by the school employees' 13 benefits board.

14 (23) "School year" means school year as defined in RCW 15 28A.150.203(11).

16 (24) "Seasonal employee" means a state employee hired to work 17 during a recurring, annual season with a duration of three months or 18 more, and anticipated to return each season to perform similar work.

19 (25) "Separated employees" means persons who separate from 20 employment with an employer as defined in:

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(a) RCW 41.32.010(17) on or after July 1, 1996; or

(b) RCW 41.35.010 on or after September 1, 2000; or

(c) RCW 41.40.010 on or after March 1, 2002;

and who are at least age fifty-five and have at least ten years of service under the teachers' retirement system plan 3 as defined in RCW 41.32.010(33), the Washington school employees' retirement system plan 3 as defined in RCW 41.35.010, or the public employees' retirement system plan 3 as defined in RCW 41.40.010.

29 (26) "State purchased health care" or "health care" means medical 30 and health care, pharmaceuticals, and medical equipment purchased 31 with state and federal funds by the department of social and health 32 services, the department of health, the basic health plan, the state 33 health care authority, the department of labor and industries, the 34 department of corrections, the department of veterans affairs, and 35 local school districts.

36 (27) "Tribal government" means an Indian tribal government as 37 defined in section 3(32) of the employee retirement income security 38 act of 1974, as amended, or an agency or instrumentality of the 39 tribal government, that has government offices principally located in 40 this state. 1 Sec. 2. RCW 41.05.050 and 2018 c 260 s 10 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

3 (1) Every: (a) Department, division, or separate agency of state government; (b) county, municipal, school district, educational 4 service district, or other political subdivisions; and (c) tribal 5 6 governments as are covered by this chapter, shall provide 7 contributions to insurance and health care plans for its employees and their dependents, the content of such plans to be determined by 8 the authority. Contributions, paid by the county, the municipality, 9 other political subdivision, or a tribal government for their 10 11 employees, shall include an amount determined by the authority to pay 12 such administrative expenses of the authority as are necessary to administer the plans for employees of those groups, except as 13 provided in subsection (4) of this section. 14

15 (2) To account for increased cost of benefits for the state and 16 for state employees, the authority may develop a rate surcharge 17 applicable to participating counties, municipalities, other political 18 subdivisions, and tribal governments.

The contributions of any: (a) Department, division, or 19 (3) separate agency of the state government; (b) county, municipal, or 20 21 other political subdivisions; (c) any tribal government as are covered by this chapter; and (d) school districts, educational 22 23 service districts, and charter schools, shall be set by the authority, subject to the approval of the governor for availability 24 25 of funds as specifically appropriated by the legislature for that 26 purpose. Insurance and health care contributions for ferry employees shall be governed by RCW 47.64.270. 27

28 (4) (a) Until January 1, 2020, the authority shall collect from each participating school district and educational service district 29 an amount equal to the composite rate charged to state agencies, plus 30 31 an amount equal to the employee premiums by plan and family size as 32 would be charged to employees, for groups of school district and 33 educational service district employees enrolled in authority plans. The authority may collect these amounts in accordance with the school 34 district or educational service district fiscal year, as described in 35 RCW 28A.505.030. 36

37 (b)(i) For all groups of school district or educational service 38 district employees enrolling in authority plans for the first time 39 after September 1, 2003, and until January 1, 2020, the authority 40 shall collect from each participating school district or educational

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1 service district an amount equal to the composite rate charged to state agencies, plus an amount equal to the employee premiums by plan 2 and by family size as would be charged to employees, only if the 3 authority determines that this method of billing the school districts 4 and educational service districts will not result in a material 5 6 difference between revenues from school districts and educational service districts and expenditures made by the authority on behalf of 7 school districts and educational service districts and their 8 employees. The authority may collect these amounts in accordance with 9 the school district or educational service district fiscal year, as 10 described in RCW 28A.505.030. 11

(ii) For all groups of educational service district employees 12 enrolling in authority plans for the first time after January 1, 13 2020, and until January 1, 2024, the authority shall collect from 14 each participating educational service district an amount equal to 15 16 the composite rate charged to state agencies, plus an amount equal to 17 the employee premiums by plan and by family size as would be charged to employees, only if the authority determines that this method of 18 billing the educational service districts will not result in a 19 material difference between revenues from educational service 20 districts and expenditures made by the authority on behalf of 21 educational service districts and their employees. The authority may 22 23 collect these amounts in accordance with the educational service district fiscal year, as described in RCW 28A.505.030. 24

25 (c) Until January 1, 2020, if the authority determines at any time that the conditions in (b) of this subsection cannot be met, the 26 authority shall offer enrollment to additional groups of school and 27 28 educational service district employees on a tiered rate structure until such time as the authority determines there would be no 29 30 material difference between revenues and expenditures under a 31 composite rate structure for all school and educational service 32 district employees enrolled in authority plans.

33 (d) (i) Beginning January 1, 2020, all school districts, educational service districts with represented employees, and charter 34 schools shall commence participation in the 35 school employees' benefits board program established under RCW 41.05.740. All school 36 districts, educational service districts with represented employees, 37 schools, school district 38 charter and all employee groups 39 participating in the public employees' benefits board plans before 40 January 1, 2020, shall thereafter participate in the school

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1 employees' benefits board program administered by the authority. All school districts, educational service districts with represented 2 3 employees, and charter schools shall provide contributions to the authority for insurance and health care plans for school employees 4 and their dependents. These contributions must be provided to the 5 6 authority for all eligible school employees eligible for benefits under RCW 41.05.740(6)(d), including school employees who have waived 7 their coverage; contributions to the authority are not required for 8 individuals eligible for benefits under RCW 41.05.740(6)(e) who waive 9 10 their coverage.

11 (ii) Beginning January 1, 2024, all educational service districts 12 shall participate in the school employees' benefits board program.

(e) For the purposes of this subsection, "tiered rates" means the amounts the authority must pay to insuring entities by plan and by family size.

16 (f) Notwithstanding this subsection and RCW 41.05.065(4), the 17 authority may allow school districts and educational service 18 districts enrolled on a tiered rate structure prior to September 1, 19 2002, and until January 1, 2020, to continue participation based on 20 the same rate structure and under the same conditions and eligibility 21 criteria.

(5) The authority shall transmit a recommendation for the amount of the employer contributions to the governor and the director of financial management for inclusion in the proposed budgets submitted to the legislature.

Sec. 3. (1) The Washington state health care 26 NEW SECTION. 27 authority, in consultation with the office of the superintendent of public instruction, educational service districts, and the office of 28 financial management, shall study employee health benefits 29 in 30 educational service districts and the impact of participation in the 31 school employees' benefits board program on educational service districts and their employees. The study must include an analysis of: 32

33 (a) Health benefit plans provided to educational service district34 employees and their costs;

35 (b) Estimated costs to educational service districts to 36 participate in the school employees' benefits board program;

37 (c) Comparisons of costs, benefits offered, and employees 38 covered, between educational service district health benefits and 39 school employees' benefits board health benefits if adopted; and

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1 (d) Revenue from school districts, state, federal, and other 2 sources that support educational service district services and their 3 ability to support rates negotiated for the school employees' 4 benefits board program.

5 (2) By December 31, 2020, the Washington state health care 6 authority must report findings from the study to the fiscal 7 committees of the legislature.

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
