AN ACT Relating to requiring the department of children, youth, and families to submit a report regarding independent living services; and amending RCW 74.13.540.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 74.13.540 and 2013 c 39 s 30 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) Independent living services include assistance in achieving basic educational requirements such as a high school equivalency 8 certificate as provided in RCW 28B.50.536, enrollment in vocational 9 10 and technical training programs offered at the community and 11 vocational colleges, and obtaining and maintaining employment; and 12 accomplishing basic life skills such as money management, nutrition, preparing meals, and cleaning house. A baseline skill level in 13 ability to function productively and independently shall 14 be 15 determined at entry. Performance shall be measured and must 16 demonstrate improvement from involvement in the program. Each recipient shall have a plan for achieving independent living skills 17 18 by the time the recipient reaches age twenty-one. The plan shall be 19 written within the first thirty days of placement and reviewed every 20 ninety days. A recipient who fails to consistently adhere to the 21 elements of the plan shall be subject to reassessment by the

1	professional staff of the program and may be declared ineligible to						
2	receive services.						
3	(2) By November 1, 2020, and annually thereafter, the department						
4	shall, in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, submit a report to the						
5	appropriate legislative committees that includes the following						
6	information on independent living services from the most recent state						
7	fiscal year that information is available, separated by provider to						
8	the degree possible:						
9	(a) A description of the services that each independent living						
10	provider is contracted to provide;						
11	(b) A description of the services delivered by each independent						
12	living provider;						
13	(c) How many children were served by each independent living						
14	provider;						
15	(d) The average and median per capita expenditures on independent						
16	living services;						
17	<u>(e) The number of young adults eighteen to twenty-one years of</u>						
18	age who received independent living services; and						
19	(f) A description of the services administered to youth who						
20	transition between counties after their eighteenth birthday.						
21	(3) If the department is unable to provide the data requested in						
22	subsection (2) of this section, it will provide a complete						
23	explanation of why it was unable to do so.						

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
