- 1 AN ACT Relating to assisting homeless individuals in obtaining
- 2 Washington state identicards; amending RCW 46.20.117; and adding a
- 3 new section to chapter 43.216 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.216 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The department shall assist individuals under the age of 8 twenty-five who do not have a permanent residence address and qualify 9 for actual cost of a Washington state identicards under RCW
- 10 46.20.117(1)(c)(ii) in obtaining a Washington state identicard.
- 11 (2) To achieve the goals of this section, the department shall:
- 12 (a) Accept Washington state identicard application materials for
- 13 individuals qualifying for a Washington state identicard under RCW
- 14 46.20.117(1)(c)(ii), including proof of identity materials required
- 15 under RCW 46.20.035, from:
- 16 (i) Individuals or entities licensed by the department;
- 17 (ii) Individuals or entities contracted to provide services by 18 the department;
- 19 (iii) Individual schools or school districts;
- 20 (iv) HOPE centers as described in RCW 43.185C.315;
- 21 (v) Crisis residential centers as described in RCW 43.185C.295;

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1 (vi) Street outreach services as defined in RCW 43.185C.010; and
2 (vii) The independent youth housing program as described in RCW
3 43.63A.305;

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- (b) Compile information received under (a) of this subsection and submit this information to the department of licensing;
- 6 (c) Develop, in consultation with the department of licensing,
 7 the office of the superintendent of public instruction, and the
 8 office of homeless youth prevention and protection programs, other
 9 forms of identification that may be common for individuals qualifying
 10 for a Washington state identicard under RCW 46.20.117(1)(c)(ii) that
 11 meet the alternative documentation requirements of the department of
 12 licensing under RCW 46.20.035.
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.117 and 2018 c 157 s 2 are each amended to 14 read as follows:
- 15 (1) **Issuance**. The department shall issue an identicard, 16 containing a picture, if the applicant:
 - (a) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;
- 18 (b) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 46.20.035; and
- 19 (c) Pays the required fee. Except as provided in subsection (5) 20 of this section, the fee is fifty-four dollars, unless an applicant 21 is:
- 22 (i) A recipient of continuing public assistance grants under 23 Title 74 RCW, who is referred in writing by the secretary of social 24 and health services;
 - (ii) Under the age of ((eighteen)) twenty-five and does not have a permanent residence address as determined by the department by rule; or
 - (iii) An individual who is scheduled to be released from an institution as defined in RCW 13.40.020, a community facility as defined in RCW 72.05.020, or other juvenile rehabilitation facility operated by the department of social and health services or the department of children, youth, and families; or an individual who has been released from such an institution or facility within thirty calendar days before the date of the application.
- For those persons under (c)(i) through (iii) of this subsection, the fee must be the actual cost of production of the identicard.
 - (2) (a) **Design and term**. The identicard must:
- 38 (i) Be distinctly designed so that it will not be confused with 39 the official driver's license; and

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- (ii) Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, expire on the sixth anniversary of the applicant's birthdate after issuance.
 - (b) The identicard may include the person's status as a veteran, consistent with RCW 46.20.161(2).
 - (3) **Renewal.** An application for identicard renewal may be submitted by means of:
 - (a) Personal appearance before the department; or

(b) Mail or electronic commerce, if permitted by rule of the department and if the applicant did not renew his or her identicard by mail or by electronic commerce when it last expired.

An identicard may not be renewed by mail or by electronic commerce unless the renewal issued by the department includes a photograph of the identicard holder.

- (4) **Cancellation**. The department may cancel an identicard if the holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the card in violation of RCW 46.20.0921.
- issue or renew an identicard for a period other than six years, or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than six years, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or extended. The department may adopt any rules as are necessary to carry out this subsection.

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
