1 AN ACT Relating to traffic control signals; and amending RCW 2 46.61.055.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 46.61.055 and 2019 c 214 s 10 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 Whenever traffic is controlled by traffic control signals 7 exhibiting different colored lights, ((or)) colored lighted arrows, or colored lighted symbols, successively one at a time or in 8 combination, only the colors green, red, and yellow shall be used, 9 10 except for ((special)) pedestrian signals ((carrying a word or 11 legend)) as provided in RCW 46.61.060, and said lights shall indicate 12 and apply to ((drivers of vehicles)) vehicle operators, pedestrians, and personal delivery devices, as follows: 13

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(1) Green indication

(a) Vehicle operators facing a circular green signal may proceed straight through or turn right or left unless a sign at such place prohibits either such turn. Vehicle operators turning right or left shall stop to allow other vehicles lawfully within the intersection control area to complete their movements. Vehicle operators turning right or left shall also stop for pedestrians who or personal 1 delivery devices that are lawfully within the intersection control 2 area as required by RCW 46.61.235(1).

(b) Vehicle operators facing a green arrow signal, shown alone or 3 in combination with another indication, may enter the intersection 4 control area only to make the movement indicated by such arrow, or 5 6 such other movement as is permitted by other indications shown at the same time. Vehicle operators shall stop to allow other vehicles 7 lawfully within the intersection control area to complete their 8 movements. Vehicle operators shall also stop for pedestrians who or 9 personal delivery devices that are lawfully within the intersection 10 11 control area as required by RCW 46.61.235(1).

12 (c) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal, as 13 provided in RCW 46.61.060 as now or hereafter amended, pedestrians or 14 personal delivery devices facing any green signal, except when the 15 sole green signal is a turn arrow, may proceed across the roadway 16 within any marked or unmarked crosswalk.

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(2) Steady yellow indication

(a) Vehicle operators facing a steady circular yellow or yellow arrow signal are thereby warned that the related green movement is being terminated or that a red indication will be exhibited immediately thereafter when vehicular traffic shall not enter the intersection. Vehicle operators shall stop for pedestrians who or personal delivery devices that are lawfully within the intersection control area as required by RCW 46.61.235(1).

(b) Pedestrians or personal delivery devices facing a steady circular yellow or yellow arrow signal, unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as provided in RCW 46.61.060 shall not enter the roadway.

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(3) Steady red indication

(a) Vehicle operators facing a steady circular red signal alone 30 31 shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before 32 entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or, if none, then before entering the intersection control area and shall 33 remain standing until an indication to proceed is shown. However, the 34 vehicle operators facing a steady circular red signal may, after 35 stopping proceed to make a right turn from a one-way or two-way 36 street into a two-way street or into a one-way street carrying 37 traffic in the direction of the right turn; or a left turn from a 38 39 one-way or two-way street into a one-way street carrying traffic in 40 the direction of the left turn; unless a sign posted by competent

authority prohibits such movement. Vehicle operators planning to make such turns shall remain stopped to allow other vehicles lawfully within or approaching the intersection control area to complete their movements. Vehicle operators planning to make such turns shall also remain stopped for pedestrians who or personal delivery devices that are lawfully within the intersection control area as required by RCW 46.61.235(1).

8 (b) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as 9 provided in RCW 46.61.060 as now or hereafter amended, pedestrians or 10 personal delivery devices facing a steady circular red signal alone 11 shall not enter the roadway.

(c) Vehicle operators facing a steady red arrow indication may 12 not enter the intersection control area to make the movement 13 indicated by such arrow, and unless entering the intersection control 14 area to make such other movement as is permitted by other indications 15 16 shown at the same time, shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering a crosswalk on the near side of the 17 intersection control area, or if none, then before entering the 18 19 intersection control area and shall remain standing until an indication to make the movement indicated by such arrow is shown. 20 21 However, the vehicle operators facing a steady red arrow indication may, after stopping proceed to make a right turn from a one-way or 22 two-way street into a two-way street or into a one-way street 23 carrying traffic in the direction of the right turn; or a left turn 24 25 from a one-way street or two-way street into a one-way street carrying traffic in the direction of the left turn; unless a sign 26 posted by competent authority prohibits such movement. Vehicle 27 operators planning to make such turns shall remain stopped to allow 28 other vehicles lawfully within or approaching the intersection 29 control area to complete their movements. Vehicle operators planning 30 31 to make such turns shall also remain stopped for pedestrians who or 32 personal delivery devices that are lawfully within the intersection control area as required by RCW 46.61.235(1). 33

(d) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian signal, pedestrians
or personal delivery devices facing a steady red arrow signal
indication shall not enter the roadway.

37 (4) <u>Traffic control signals intended specifically for bicyclists</u>

1 (5) If an official traffic control signal is erected and 2 maintained at a place other than an intersection, the provisions of 3 this section shall be applicable except as to those provisions which 4 by their nature can have no application. Any stop required shall be 5 made at a sign or marking on the pavement indicating where the stop 6 shall be made, but in the absence of any such sign or marking the 7 stop shall be made at the signal.

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
