## SECOND SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5019

State of Washington 66th Legislature 2019 Regular Session

**By** Senate Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senators Takko and Rivers)

AN ACT Relating to modifying the expiration date of certain state fire service mobilization laws; amending 2015 c 181 s 5 (uncodified); reenacting and amending RCW 43.43.960; providing an effective date; providing an expiration date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 43.43.960 and 2015 c 181 s 2 are each reenacted and 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 9 this section apply throughout this subchapter.

10 (1) "All risk resources" means those resources regularly provided 11 by fire departments, fire districts, and regional fire protection 12 service authorities required to respond to natural or man-made 13 incidents, including but not limited to:

- 14 (a) Wild land fires;
- 15 (b) Landslides;
- 16 (c) Earthquakes;
- 17 (d) Floods; and
- 18 (e) Contagious diseases.
- 19 (2) "Chief" means the chief of the Washington state patrol.

20 (3) "Fire chief" includes the chief officer of a statutorily 21 authorized fire agency, or the fire chief's authorized

1 representative. Also included are the department of natural resources 2 fire control chief, and the department of natural resources regional 3 managers.

4 (4) "Jurisdiction" means state, county, city, fire district,
5 regional fire protection service authority, or port district units,
6 or other units covered by this chapter.

(5) "Mobilization" means that all risk resources regularly 7 provided by fire departments, fire districts, and regional fire 8 protection service authorities beyond those available through 9 existing agreements will be requested and, when available, sent in 10 11 response to an emergency or disaster situation that has exceeded the 12 capabilities of available local resources. During a large scale emergency, mobilization includes the redistribution of regional or 13 14 statewide risk resources to either direct emergency incident assignments or to assignment in communities where resources are 15 needed. ((Fire department)) All risk resources may not be mobilized 16 17 to assist law enforcement with police activities during a civil protest or demonstration, however, fire departments, fire districts, 18 19 and regional fire protection service authorities are not restricted from providing medical care or aid and firefighting when mobilized 20 21 for any purpose.

When mobilization is declared and authorized as provided in this 22 23 chapter, all risk resources regularly provided by fire departments, fire districts, and regional fire protection service authorities 24 25 including those of the host fire protection authorities, i.e. 26 incident jurisdiction, shall be deemed as mobilized under this chapter, including those that responded earlier under existing mutual 27 28 aid or other agreement. All nonhost fire protection authorities providing resources in response to a mobilization declaration shall 29 be eligible for expense reimbursement as provided by this chapter 30 31 from the time of the mobilization declaration.

32 This chapter shall not reduce or suspend the authority or 33 responsibility of the department of natural resources under chapter 34 76.04 RCW.

35 (6) "Mutual aid" means emergency interagency assistance provided 36 without compensation under an agreement between jurisdictions under 37 chapter 39.34 RCW.

38 (7) "State fire marshal" means the director of fire protection in 39 the Washington state patrol.

3 This act expires July 1, ((<del>2019</del>)) <u>2024</u>.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 2019.

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
