## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5847

State of Washington 66th Legislature 2019 Regular Session

**By** Senate Transportation (originally sponsored by Senators Cleveland, Rivers, Wilson, L., Hasegawa, and Kuderer)

1 AN ACT Relating to facilitating transportation projects of 2 statewide significance; adding new sections to chapter 47.05 RCW; and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Washington's 6 transportation needs are increasing as both a surge in trade and 7 population create demand on the system. Large transportation projects 8 that provide improvements in accessibility, freight mobility, and 9 safety, as well as maximize economic development, are critical to 10 Washington's future. It is the intent of the legislature to recognize 11 transportation projects of statewide significance, and to expedite 12 their completion through the establishment of a formal process of coordination. 13

14NEW SECTION.Sec. 2.A new section is added to chapter 47.0515RCW to read as follows:

16 (1) A transportation project of statewide significance means a 17 project that will:

18 (a) Improve accessibility for a significant number of Washington19 residents;

(b) Alleviate congestion and improve the reliability of travel
 times for Washington residents and other users of the transportation
 system;

4 (c) Improve the movement of freight through the corridor;

5 (d) Provide safety improvements and contribute to a reduction in 6 injuries and fatalities;

7 (e) Maximize opportunities for economic development in the region 8 and the state;

9 (f) Make improvement to transit, pedestrian, and bike access; and 10 (g) Serve as a critical route for both national and state 11 defense.

12 (2) In order to qualify as a transportation project of statewide significance, the reasonable cost estimate to construct the project 13 must be at least one billion dollars. Similarly, if a project is to 14 be constructed in phases, in order to qualify as a transportation 15 16 project of statewide significance, the total reasonable cost estimate 17 to construct all the phases must be at least one billion dollars. For purposes of this subsection, "cost estimate to construct" 18 19 includes costs associated with design, preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition, and construction. 20

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 47.05 22 RCW to read as follows:

23 (1) The department shall:

24 (a) Develop an application for designation of transportation projects as transportation projects of statewide significance. The 25 application must be accompanied by a letter of approval from the 26 27 legislative authority of at least one jurisdiction that will have the proposed transportation project of statewide significance within its 28 boundaries. No designation of a project as a transportation project 29 30 of statewide significance shall be made without the letter of 31 approval, except as provided in subsection (2) of this section. The letter of approval must state that the jurisdiction joins in the 32 request for the designation of the transportation project as one of 33 statewide significance and has or will hire the professional staff 34 that will be required to expedite the processes necessary to the 35 completion of a transportation project of statewide significance. The 36 transportation project proponents may provide the funding necessary 37 38 for the jurisdiction to hire the professional staff that will be required to so expedite. The application must contain information 39

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1 regarding the location of the project, how the project meets the 2 criteria specified in section 2 of this act, and other information 3 required by the department; and

4 (b) Designate a transportation project as a transportation 5 project of statewide significance if the department determines, after 6 review of the application under criteria adopted by rule, the 7 transportation project will meet the criteria listed in section 2 (1) 8 and (2) of this act.

9 (2) Any project designated by the legislature and codified in 10 this chapter is not subject to the application requirements set out 11 in subsection (1) of this section. However, the project is subject to 12 the coordination process in subsection (3) of this section.

13 (3) The department shall assign a project facilitator or 14 coordinator to each transportation project of statewide significance 15 to:

(a) Assemble a team of state and local government and private
officials to help meet the planning, permitting, and development
needs of each project. The team must include those responsible for
planning, permitting, and licensing, infrastructure development,
workforce development services, transportation services, and the
provision of utilities; and

(b) Work with each team member to expedite their actions in furtherance of the project and coordinate any cross border communications, if applicable.

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
