1 AN ACT Relating to exempting election security information from 2 public records disclosure; amending RCW 42.56.420; creating a new 3 section; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 42.56.420 and 2017 c 149 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 The following information relating to security is exempt from 8 disclosure under this chapter:

9 (1) Those portions of records assembled, prepared, or maintained 10 to prevent, mitigate, or respond to criminal terrorist acts, which 11 are acts that significantly disrupt the conduct of government or of 12 the general civilian population of the state or the United States and 13 that manifest an extreme indifference to human life, the public 14 disclosure of which would have a substantial likelihood of 15 threatening public safety, consisting of:

(a) Specific and unique vulnerability assessments or specific and unique response or deployment plans, including compiled underlying data collected in preparation of or essential to the assessments, or to the response or deployment plans; and

20 (b) Records not subject to public disclosure under federal law 21 that are shared by federal or international agencies, and information 1 prepared from national security briefings provided to state or local 2 government officials related to domestic preparedness for acts of 3 terrorism;

(2) Those portions of records containing specific and unique 4 vulnerability assessments or specific and unique emergency and escape 5 response plans at a city, county, or state adult or juvenile 6 correctional facility, or secure facility for persons civilly 7 confined under chapter 71.09 RCW, the public disclosure of which 8 would have a substantial likelihood of threatening the security of a 9 city, county, or state adult or juvenile correctional facility, 10 secure facility for persons civilly confined under chapter 71.09 RCW, 11 12 or any individual's safety;

(3) Information compiled by school districts or schools in the development of their comprehensive safe school plans under RCW 28A.320.125, to the extent that they identify specific vulnerabilities of school districts and each individual school;

17 (4) Information regarding the public and private infrastructure and security of computer and telecommunications networks, consisting 18 19 of security passwords, security access codes and programs, access codes for secure software applications, security and service recovery 20 21 plans, security risk assessments in their entirety, and security test 22 results to the extent that they identify specific system 23 vulnerabilities, and other such information the release of which may increase risk to the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of 24 25 security, information technology infrastructure, or assets;

(5) The system security and emergency preparedness plan required under RCW 35.21.228, 35A.21.300, 36.01.210, 36.57.120, 36.57A.170, and 81.112.180; ((and))

(6) Personally identifiable information of employees, and other security information, of a private cloud service provider that has entered into a criminal justice information services agreement as contemplated by the United States department of justice criminal justice information services security policy, as authorized by 28 C.F.R. Part 20;

35 <u>(7) The continuity of operations plan for election operations,</u> 36 and any security audits, security risk assessments, or security test 37 results relating to physical security or cybersecurity of election 38 operations or infrastructure. These records are exempt from 39 disclosure in their entirety; and 1 <u>(8) Those portions of records containing information about</u> 2 <u>election infrastructure, election security, or potential threats to</u> 3 <u>election security, the public disclosure of which would have a</u> 4 <u>substantial likelihood of increasing risk to the integrity of</u> 5 <u>election operations or infrastructure</u>.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The exemptions in this act apply to any 7 public records requests made prior to the effective date of this 8 section for which the disclosure of records has not already occurred.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 11 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 12 effect immediately.

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
