Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current federal law, states may create a qualified Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) program under which an individual may establish a tax-exempt savings account to pay for qualified expenses, such as education, housing, and transportation costs, for a beneficiary who is an individual with disabilities, as defined under federal law. Although these accounts cannot be established under this state's law, they can be established under another state's law, and if so established, contributions to these accounts are deductible from income and qualifying withdrawals from these accounts are exempt from taxation in this state.

This bill requires the Department of Financial Institutions to implement a qualified ABLE program under section 529A of the Internal Revenue Code, either directly or by entering into an agreement with another state or alliance of states. As it relates to individual income tax, the bill does not change the existing deduction for account contributions or the exemption for withdrawals. For fiscal year 2022, the existing law provision reduced revenue by approximately \$180,000. To the extent that establishing a state program encourages more Wisconsin residents to create or contribute to accounts, the bill may increase deductions claimed by Wisconsin residents for ABLE accounts. The bill is likely to result in a minimal revenue reduction.
