2023 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 134

February 23, 2024 - Introduced by Representatives Conley, Andraca, Drake, EMERSON, JOERS, MOORE OMOKUNDE, OHNSTAD, ORTIZ-VELEZ, RATCLIFF, SHANKLAND, SINICKI and SUBECK, cosponsored by Senators Spreitzer, Larson, Roys and AGARD. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: designating the month of March as Endosalpingiosis Awareness
2	Month.
3	Whereas, Endosalpingiosis is a rare disease that primarily affects women
4	between the ages of 20-49 years; and
5	Whereas, Endosalpingiosis is characterized by the presence of tubal epithelium
6	outside of the fallopian tube; and
7	Whereas, the prevalence of Endosalpingiosis is difficult to establish, since it is
8	diagnosed only through surgical biopsy; and
9	Whereas, common symptoms of Endosalpingiosis include pelvic pain,
10	infertility, menstrual irregularities, and dyspareunia, along with chronic back pain
11	being reported as a common issue years before diagnosis; and
12	Whereas, some of the biggest issues that patients face are uncertainty about
13	how the condition develops and a lack of doctors who specialize in Endosalpingiosis;

Whereas, there is currently no cure or known treatment for Endosalpingiosis,	
and there is little research being done to better understand the disease, so increasing	
awareness and educating the public is vital to supporting those impacted by	
Endosalpingiosis in our state; and	
Whereas, nonprofit groups such as Endosalpingiosis Foundation are working	
tirelessly to provide a much-needed support system for those who have been	
diagnosed and to continue to raise awareness and funding for research; and	
Whereas, Endosalpingiosis Awareness Month gives Wisconsin residents the	
opportunity to learn more about this condition and increase the resources and	
support available; now, therefore, be it	
Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the month of March	
shall be designated as Endosalpingiosis Awareness Month.
