



2011 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 28

April 12, 2011 – Introduced by Representatives VOS, STEINEKE, KESTELL, AUGUST, MEYER, STRACHOTA, NYGREN, SEVERSON, PETRYK, KRUG, ZIEGELBAUER, PETERSEN, BIES, SPANBAUER, LEMAHIEU, KLEEFISCH, ENDSLEY, HONADEL and MURSAU, cosponsored by Senators LEIBHAM, LASEE, HOPPER, GALLOWAY, LAZICH, MOULTON and DARLING. Referred to Committee on Insurance.

1 **To create** section 27 of article I of the constitution; **relating to:** the right of the
2 people to contract privately for health care services and health care coverage,
3 and prohibiting requiring a person to obtain or maintain health insurance
4 coverage or to participate in any health care system or plan (first
5 consideration).

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This constitutional amendment, proposed to the 2011 legislature on first consideration, provides that the people have the right to enter into private contracts with health care providers for health care services and to purchase private health care coverage, and prohibits enactment of any law that requires any person to obtain or maintain health insurance coverage or to participate in any health care system or plan.

A constitutional amendment requires adoption by two successive legislatures, and ratification by the people, before it can become effective.
