Relating to: proclaiming November 20, 2019, as Wisconsin's Transgender Day of

3	Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance, which occurs annually on
4	November 20, is a day to memorialize those who have been murdered as a result of
5	transphobia and to bring attention to the continued violence endured by the
6	transgender community; and
7	Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance was founded in 1999 by
8	Gwendolyn Ann Smith, a transgender woman, to memorialize the murder of
9	transgender woman Rita Hester in Allston, Massachusetts; and
10	Whereas, since its inception, Transgender Day of Remembrance has been held
11	annually on November 20, and it has slowly evolved from the web-based project
12	started by Smith into an international day of action; and
13	Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance has been observed in over 185
14	cities throughout more than 20 countries; and

Whereas, Transgender Day of Remembrance memorials traditionally include a reading of the names of those who lost their lives during the previous year, and may include other actions, such as candlelight vigils and marches; now, therefore, be it *Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That* the Wisconsin Legislature does hereby recognize and proclaim November 20, 2019, to be Wisconsin's Transgender Day of Remembrance.
